# Dodgers & Redlegs Lose Double Games; Yanks Win

St. Louis Cardinals and Brooklyn Dodgers each hit the halfway mark—77 games—of the National League race Sunday with the Cardinals entrenched in first place and the champions in fifth.

The Dodgers' are in fifth place although they are only five games astern of the Cards. A double whacking by Philadelphia Phils 2-1 and 5-3 sent the Brooks spinning out of the first division. It was the first time since 1948 that the Dodgers reached the halfway point in the lower half of the standings.

A lot of shuffling took place in the old league as Milwaukee Braves beat Chicago, 4-2, St. Louis raked up Cincinnati Redlegs twice, 3-2 and 9-4, and Pittsburgh clubbed New York Giants, 10-6, and 8-1.

Cincinnati fell from second to fourth, three percentage points behind Philadelphia which vaulted from fifth to third. Milwaukee

moved up from third to second. There was even a slight shakeup in the lower regions where the Pirates moved out of the cellar and the Cubs fell in.

The Pirates are six points ahead of Chicago although a half game behind the Cubs in the won-lost columns.

Outfielder Joe Cunningham was the star of the Cards' two wins which lengthened their streak to five and nine of the last 10. He drove in all three runs in the opener, the first two with a homer, and the winner with a 10th-inning single.

He collected three hits in each game to zoom his batting mark to .391. Joe got help from Wally Moon and Bobby Gene Smith in the closer. Moon contributed a double and his 15th homer. Smith drove in four runs with a single, triple and homer.

A crowd of 30,516, largest of the St. Louis season, enjoyed the sweep. But at Milwaukee a crowd of 33,616 paid their way into County Stadium to boost the Braves' attendance past the 1,000,000 mark—1,008,980 to be exact. It was the second earliest date that the Braves reached the mark since the shift from Boston in 1953.

Lew Burdette hurled a six-hitter for his first victory since May 18. A three-run spree, highlighted by successive triples by Wes Covington and Frank Torre, sent Lew on his way.

In the American League, Chicago White Sox, refusing to play dead, bowled over Cleveland's Indians twice, 9-8 in a 13-inning marathon, and 7-2, to cut the lead of the pace-setting New York Yankees to 2½ games. The Yanks sheared Washington, 7-5, for the Senators' sixth straight loss.

**BOSTON LOSES**

Baltimore thumped Boston 8-4, on Bob Nieman's four runs batted in, and Detroit whipped Kansas City, 5-2 with Al Kaline and Charley Maxwell driving in all Tiger runs.

Yogi Berra slammed a three-run double off Chuck Stobbs to feature a Yankee four-run uprising in the eighth inning that wrecked the Senators. Roy Sievers whacked his 20th homer for Washington.

Jim Rivera's triple and Luis Aparicio's game-winning single in the 13th gave the White Sox an uphill win over Cleveland in a first game requiring four hours, 23 minutes. The Indians, with Rocky Colavito slugging his 14th homer, led 6-0 at one stage.

Colavito clouted another in the first inning off Early Wynn second game but the Sox sewed that one up early with three runs' man, who pitched a five-hitter.

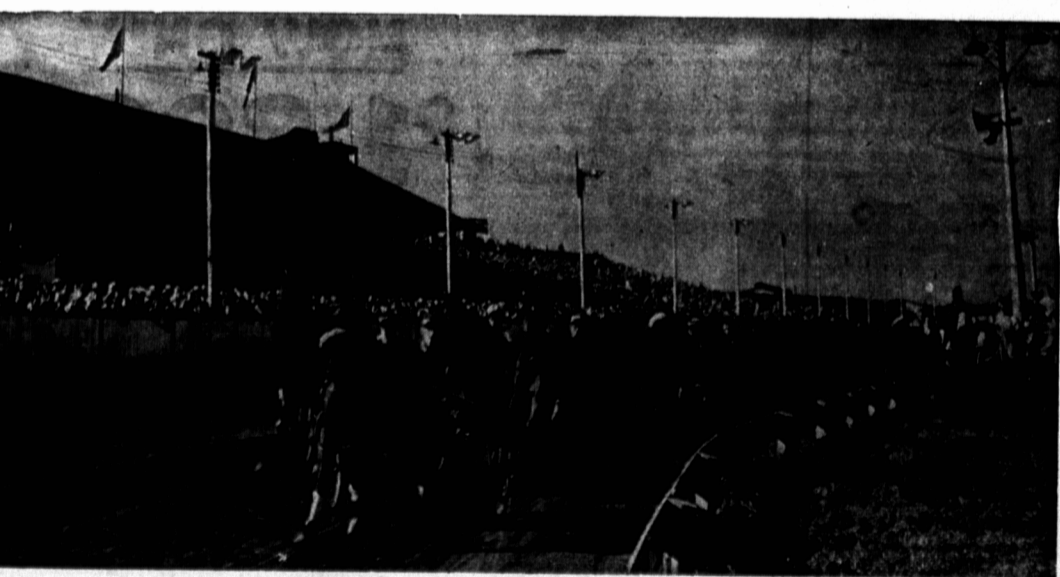
