**New Deal To Quebec Pledged By Douglas**

MONTREAL (CP)—New Democratic Party Leader T. C. Douglas pledged a new deal for French-speaking Canada in his final bid for support in Quebec province before next Monday's general election. He told a standing-room audience, estimated between 2,000 and 2,500, in the downtown Atwater Market that not all the formulas for building a bilingual unit could be found overnight. In seeking to cement the partnership between the French and English-speaking nations of Canada and in finding new ways to enlarge the culture of each, the NDP offered a program of "co-operative federalism." Mr. Douglas said an NDP government would not penalize financially a province, such as Quebec, which decided not to participate in a federal-provincial program affecting education, language or similar rights under the British North American Act. "The New Democratic Party believes that it must have a right to claim equivalent funds with no strings attached." **MAKES PROMISE** Recognizing the sociological fact of a "French Canadian nation within Confederation," the 37-year-old NDP leader added his party would: 1. Establish French as a working language in the federal civil service, including the higher levels of government, on a par with English. 2. Appoint an equal number of distinguished French and English-speaking Canadians to carry out a royal commission study on Canadian federalism and bi-culturalism, first suggested by Mr. Douglas last February. 3. Propose to the provinces a more generous division of shared tax fields and re-design to equalization payments to the provinces on the basis of fiscal needs. In the case of Quebec, he said the province's desire to forge a new society had his "deepest sympathy." It would be a massive change was thwarted by lack of funds.
