Canadiens Down N. Y. Rangers 4-1

MONTREAL (CP)—Rookie Ronnie Marshall, playing his fourth game in the National Hockey League, scored two goals Saturday night to lead Montreal Canadiens to a 4-1 victory over New York Rangers.

The loss extended the Rangers' winless streak to 13 games.

Jean Beliveau and Floyd Curry were the other scorers for Montreal while Dean Prentice notched the only New York tally.

A crowd of 14,037 saw the Montrealers romp into an early lead in the first period of Marshall's first goal. The rookie centre, who missed nearly half the season with a broken leg sustained in fall training, scored from a scramble in front of the New York net.

Prentice then tied the score on a sustained power play, 12 seconds after a penalty to Floyd Curry expired.

The Montrealers added two more goals in the wild second period, marked by tripping and elbowing by players on both teams. Beliveau counted on a hard slap shot and Curry scored at 18:36.

Marshall scored his second goal of the night and the second of his National Hockey League career at 3:44 of the final period.

Ron Howell, a rookie from the junior Guelph Biltmores, made his debut with the Rangers and was

used frequently on right wing.

Can Have Gavilan Contract For \$50,000

NEW YORK (AP)—If anyone wants Kid Gavilan's contract, he can have it for a price beginning at \$50,000, manager Angel Lopez said Friday.

The former welterweight champion from Cuba is feuding with Lopez and says he won't fight again for his longtime pilot.

"The contract will go to the highest bidder," said Lopez, "and the price begins at \$50,000."

"I'm willing to negotiate," Lopez added, "but I'm not going to give his contract to somebody as a Christmas present."

His contract with the 28-year-old Cuban runs until June, 1957.

Red Wings Edge Maple Leafs 3-2

TORONTO (CP)—Right winger Bill Dineen flashed back to his fine form as a rookie Christmas night as Detroit Red Wings edged Toronto Maple Leafs 3-2 in a rough National Hockey League game marked by a second-period outburst of violence that netted 50 minutes in penalties.

The 22-year-old native of Arvida, Que., counted two goals as Detroit outplayed Toronto over the first two periods and then staved off a lead drive for the tying goal in the final frame.

The Red Wings, who stretched their lead to three points over the third-place Toronto club, outshot the Leafs in the first period but it ended with Toronto ahead 1-0 on Teeder Kennedy's tally from the goalmouth.

Dineen, who potted 17 goals last season when he broke into the NHL, tied it at 2:30 of the second frame.

About three minutes later the Wings were swarming around goalie Harry Lumley when a battle royal broke out. It was triggered by centre Earl Reibel who roughed up Lumley while standing in the goal.

Lumley threw down his stick and whaled into Reibel.

Soccer Results

LONDON (CP)—Wolverhampton Wanderers managed to hold first place in English League first division soccer only by goal average Saturday as they lost 3-1 to Everton while second-place Sunderland played 1-1 with Huddersfield.

Dave Hickson, Everton's centre-forward, was one of the main reasons for the Wolves' defeat as he scored two goals for Everton.

Charlton moved into third place in the first division by beating Sheffield Wednesday 3-0 with inside left Eddie Firmani scoring all three goals, his third hat-trick in the last five games.

In a game between two London teams, Arsenal defeated Chelsea 1-0 on a goal by centre forward Tommy Lawton.

ROVERS GAIN LEAD
 Blackburn Rovers gained the lead in the second division by downing Doncaster 3-1 while Leeds United was able to get only a 1-1 draw with Middlesbrough.

Both Blackburn and Leeds United have the same number of points but the Rovers lead on goal average.

Bristol City regained first place in the southern section of Division III with a 2-1 win over Reading.

In the northern section, Scunthorpe United held its one-point lead with an easy 4-2 win over Bradford City.

In the Scottish League, Aberdeen kept on top of Division A with a 4-3 victory over Stirling Albion while Airdrieonians held the five-point lead in Division B with a 5-1 win over Alloa Athletic.

MAJOR DONNYBROOK

Soon everyone on the ice except Terry Sawchuk in the Detroit cage was in the battle. The excitement was too much for Marcel Bonin of the Wings and Leafs' Larry Cahoon who leaped over the boards from the players' bench and waded in.

It took referee Jerry Olinaki and the two linesmen about 15 minutes to restore order and decide on the penalties.

Bonin and Cahoon received 10-minute misconduct penalties and automatic \$25 fines for going out on the ice. Reibel picked up a five-minute major for fighting and defenseman Marcel Pronovost of the Wings got two majors, for high-sticking and fighting.

FINE FOR LUMLEY

Rearguard Jim Morrison, Kennedy and Lumley picked up majors for fighting. In addition Lumley probably will be fined \$50 for going out of his net to get at Pronovost after he had disposed of Reibel.

The penalty box was finally vacant at 19:05 when Red Kelly let fly a shot from outside the Toronto blue-line. Lumley glided out to meet it but the puck took an odd hop and slithered into the corner of the net.

Dineen gave Detroit a 3-1 margin at 8:55 of the final period and centre Ted Sloan made it 3-2 five minutes later.

Lumley was removed for an extra attacker with one minute and 44 seconds left but there was no crack in the Red Wing armor. The period's only penalty went to Sawchuk in the final minute.

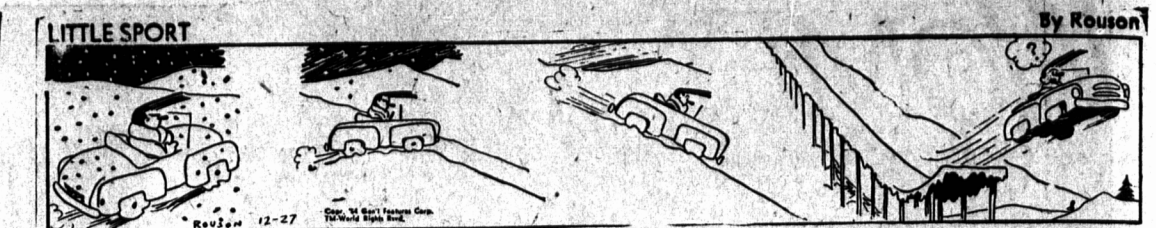

Cleveland Wins National League Football Title

CLEVELAND (AP)—Otto Graham, who says he is going to retire, passed for three touchdowns Sunday as Cleveland Browns walloped Detroit Lions 56-10 in the National Football League's championship playoff.

Before a Cleveland Stadium crowd of 43,827, Graham personally smashed Detroit's effort to win an unprecedented third straight professional title.

The Browns, 2 1/2-point underdogs, struck for five first-half touchdowns and a 35-10 intermission lead to score their first victory in nine meetings with the Lions since 1951.

Graham, who had announced this was his last game after nine Brown seasons, thrilled the throng as well as a vast national TV audience with touchdown passes of 37, 10 and 31 yards and scoring smashes from the five-yard line, two-foot line and one-foot line.

Final Minute Goal Gives Bruins 3-3 Tie With Hawks

BOSTON (CP)—Left-winger Doug Mohs beat goalie Hank Bassen with a 40-footer in the final minute to give Boston Bruins a 3-3 tie with Chicago Black Hawks in a National Hockey League game Saturday night before 9,729 fans.

The tying goal capped a comeback after the Hawks had taken a 2-0 lead on goals by Harry Watson in each of the first two periods.

Cal Gardner and Fern Flaman tallied for the Bruins in the third period to tie the score 2-2, then Nick Mickoski skated from behind the Boston goal to slam in Gord Hollingworth's long shot at 13:32 to put the Hawks ahead again.

With the Bruins appearing headed for defeat, Mohs scored on the long shot at 19:07 on a pass from Real Chevrestis.

Watson's two goals brought the total for his NHL career to 204.

Barbara Ann Scott Has Virus Infection

CHICAGO (AP)—Barbara Ann Scott, former Olympic figure skater and star of the Hollywood Ice Revue, is expected back in the show today after a two-day struggle with a virus infection.

The Ottawa-born skater was forced to pass up the traditional Christmas night opening performance and Sunday night's televised show.

Scott's ailment was not considered serious. However, she was confined to her hotel room and her mother, Mrs. Clyde Scott, forbade her daughter from making an appearance Sunday.

It was the first time she had ever missed a scheduled performance.

Rocky Marciano Selected As "Fighter Of The Year"

NEW YORK (AP)—Heavyweight champion Rocky Marciano, for the second time in three years, has been chosen "fighter of the year" by Ring magazine.

In a copyrighted article, editor Nat Fleischer says the Brockton, Mass., blockbuster was chosen by a slight margin over middleweight King Carl (Bobo) Olson of San Francisco, Ring's selection of 1953.

Archie Moore, lightweight titleholder, is third in the list, followed by Pascual Perez, Argentina's world flyweight champ, and Robert Cohen of France, bantamweight champion.

Marciano, selected for the Ring award first in 1952, defended his crown twice, both times against Ezzard Charles. His second bout with Charles, in which he stopped the former champion in the eighth round, was rated the "fight of the year."

Despite National Boxing Association action in stripping both featherweight champion Sandy Saddler of New York and Cohen of their titles for not defending within a specified time, Fleischer lists both as champions and at the head of their divisions.

SAXTON PLACED THIRD
 Johnny Saxton, newly-crowned welterweight king, is the only champion not ranked at the head of his division. Ring rates him third behind Carmen Basilio of Canastota, N. Y., and Kid Gavilan, who lost his title to Saxton.

In the heavyweight class, "Nino" Valdes of Cuba is ranked as top challenger. Don Cockell of England is second, Charles third, Bob Baker of Pittsburgh fourth and Earl Walls of Edmonton fifth.

Billy Smith of Atlantic City, N.J., and Joey Maxim of Cleveland are ranked one-two for Moore's lightweight crown.

Joey Giardello of Philadelphia is No. 1 challenger for Olson's title. Paddy Demarco of Brooklyn is rated top threat for Jimmy Carter's lightweight title and Teddy Davis of Hartford, Conn., No. 1 for Saddler's featherweight championship.

Opening Matches Today in Davis Cup Round

SYDNEY, Australia. (AP)—Tony Trabert of Cincinnati was pitted against Lewis Hoad of Australia, and Vic Seixas of Philadelphia was scheduled against Ken Rosewall in the opening singles matches of the Davis Cup tennis challenge round today.

The Trabert-Hoad test was scheduled for 1 p.m. Australian time (10 p.m. EST Sunday) with Seixas and Rosewall taking the court afterward. A sellout crowd of 25,578 was assured.

Most observers, both Australian and American, predicted the opening match between two of the game's heavyweights would decide the future residence of the Cup.

OTTAWA (CP)—An RCAF hockey team from Zweibrucken, Germany will compete in around-robin series for a European trophy, the Spengler Cup, at Davos, Switzerland later this month.

Air force headquarters here said Friday the team from No. 3 Fighter Wing will meet an Italian squad Dec. 28, the German title holders Dec. 29 and the Swiss team Dec. 30.

The RCAF team will also play exhibition games including one against the Swiss championship team at Arosa. Top scorers this season with the Flyers are LAC. Yves Garand of Ottawa and Cpl. Frank Outway of Summerside, P. E. I. Playing in the German league last year, the Flyers won 9, lost three and tied three.

Cpl. Outway, a native of Summerside, was a member of the Summerside Kinsmen Juveniles which brought Summerside its first juvenile crown in 1945-46 defeating Sydney, N. S. In 1947-48 he was a member of the Summerside All Stars which played off each of those years with the Bathurst Papermakers and which were edged out by a narrow margin for the championship. This team was coached by Windy Steele and managed by the late Harold Meivier.

In baseball Outway, in 1948-49 was a member of the Summerside All Stars, playing first base. This team captured the Maritime baseball crown for Summerside for the first time.

In 1948 he was batting champion of the three team baseball league and won the Dr. A. R. Grant trophy.

The committee in charge point out that almost all of the instruments now in use are borrowed and may be subject to recall at any time; other instruments have been purchased by the parents of children; music stands and instruments have been donated by three leading citizens but several key instruments are still lacking.
