S'ide Police Continue Clean-Up Following Breaks

Summerside police observed no holiday yesterday as they continued their crime-smashing drive to clean up the town.
Two more men were taken into custody yesterday, and the police continued to add to the sizeable supply of stolen merchandise they have recovered.

This all out effort on the part of the police began early Wednesday morning and Chief of Police Peter White yesterday afternoon expressed determination to continue the action in bringing a swift end to the current crime wave of breaks and theft.
Court appearances may begin today by those who have been taken into custody in connection with the breaking, entering, and theft cases.

Juveniles, some of whom are awaiting acceptance at the reform school on the mainland, were also picked up by police yesterday after having stolen a car belonging to James Hogan, Jr., and driven it to Port Hill which was fast as the gas supply would allow. It is understood that the car was recovered undamaged.

Four Deaths In N.B.
SAINT JOHN, N.B., Dec. 26 - New Brunswick's fourth fatality of the holiday season occurred today when Miss Jean Seely, elderly Saint John resident, died after being struck by a car yesterday.
Other accidental deaths since Christmas morning were those of Wallace Chamberlain, 27, Annapolis; Elizabeth Hayes, 3, Renous; and Trooper Myron Thorne, 17, Salem. Chamberlain was struck by pieces of an emery wheel which broke at high speed. The Hayes child fell from her father's truck when a door flew open. Thorne, of the 8th Princess Louise's Hussars, was thrown from an army truck when it skidded in the Havelock area.

Go Off Ferry
TRAIL, B.C., Dec. 26 (CP) - Three persons all teen-aged, were drowned last night when trapped in the cab of a truck which plunged from a ferry into the Columbia River at a Castlear, about 20 miles north of Trail. Three others were rescued.
Dead are: Paul Davidoff, 17, of Pincher Creek, Alta., said by police to have been driver of the truck; Olga Soukroff, 16, of Thrums, B.C.; and Bonnie Loff, 18, of Glade, B.C.
Those rescued were Bernard Loff, 16, of Glade; George Kabatoff, 16, of Thrums; and Mary Abrossimoff, 15, also of Thrums.

Police said the truck apparently ran down the ferry ramp out of control, shot across the ferry and broke through the guard chain plunging into 35 feet of water.
