The Opposition Flirtation. The incessant folly of those who have been preaching gospel of Canadian poverty and dependence upon the United States is now beginning to be seen.

Trade at Souris. We have obtained from the Collector of Customs at Souris a statement of the shipments from that port in the past season.

The chief exports in vessels were,—potatoes, valued at \$25,238.00; oats, valued at \$23,645.00; lobsters, valued at \$27,827.00; mackerel, valued at \$24,541.00, codfish, etc., to the value of \$7,900.00.

In view of the large and increasing shipments from Souris by water, the Dominion Government will do well if they see to it that the breakwater is at once thoroughly repaired.

Matthew & McLean and occupied by them as a can shop and by Mr. Thompson, of Halifax, as a meat factory. The contents of the building were destroyed, and the adjoining premises were saved with difficulty. We understand that there was no insurance. The fire is said to have caught from the furnace.

PARLIAMENT OF CANADA. Opening Scenes.

Parliament was opened on Monday with more display than for some years. By one o'clock a healthy crowd of both sexes was assailing the entrance to the Senate lobby. About two o'clock the swells commenced to arrive, and, being in full dress, were admitted at another entrance, and gained the floor of the Senate without difficulty.

Itself a richly upholstered room, with beautiful stained glass windows, the dresses of the ladies and their flashing jewels, the uniforms of the Governor-General and his staff, and of the Privy Councillors, the purple vestments of the Archbishop, the crimson of Archbishop Laud, the scarlet and ermine of the judges, and the gown and chain of the Mayor, altogether, formed an imposing scene.

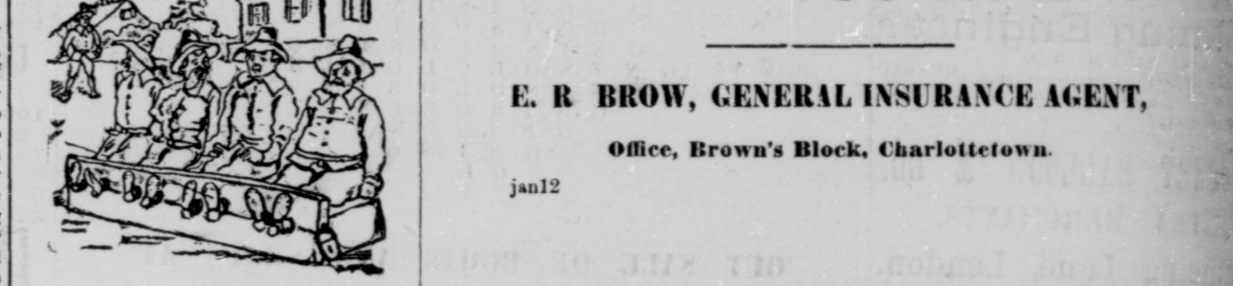
