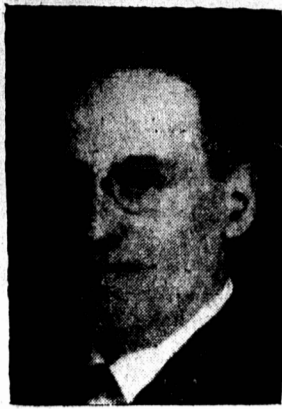


Bank Of Nova Scotia Officers Are Elected

Souris Pilot Injured In Ontario Crash

ALLMERE, Ont., Aug. 7 — (CP) — A light prop-dusting plane crashed into a tree here yesterday, critically injuring the pilot, Philip Paquet, 32, of Souris, P. E. I. Paquet is in hospital at St. Thomas.

The plane a Piper Cub 'G3', crashed on the farm of John Fizekas, R.R.2, Aylmer, Paquet, an employee of Lavers Bros. Air Services Ltd., Toronto, was dusting tobacco crops in company with two other aircraft.

Hospital authorities said Paquet suffered severe fractures of both ankles, severe and extensive facial lacerations, undetermined chest injuries, and possible internal injuries. He is reported to have received his discharge from the R.C.A.F. headquarters at Trenton, Ont., last month.
