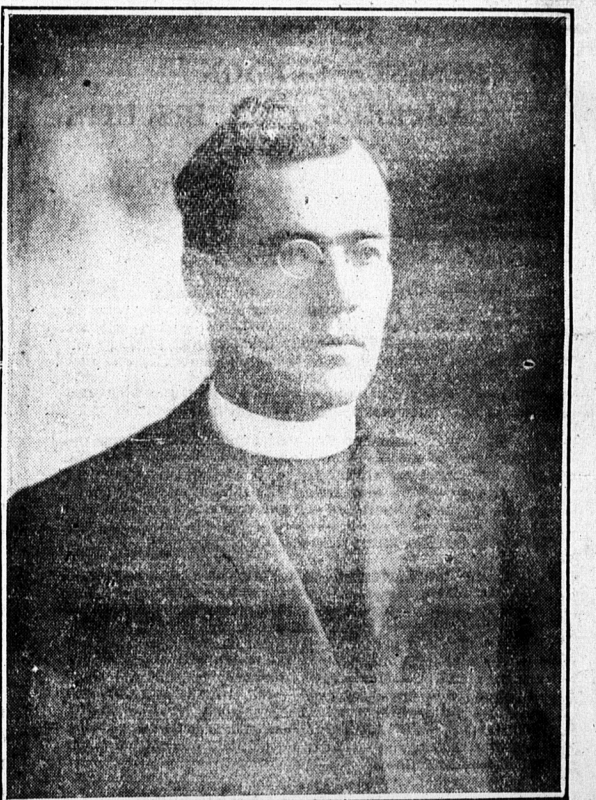

McKinnon, the next speaker, expressed the pleasure it always gave him to attend the Commencement exercises of St. Dunstan's and to see the large classes of promising young graduates which this splendid university is turning out from year to year. He congratulated the graduates most heartily and wished them every success.

Sir Charles Dalton, called upon, also voiced his pleasure at being present at the closing exercises in the building up of a nation where education and he was very pleased to see the good work being done by St. Dunstan's. His own donation towards the university had been alluded to by Bishop O'Leary and this year was in itself a full recompense. He trusted that next year and during the succeeding years equally excellent classes would be turned out, and that the good work would go on with increasing vigor.

Premier Bell, U. S. Consul Crosby, His Worship Mayor Jenkins and Judge Arsenault followed in brief addresses, congratulating the University staff and the graduates upon the excellent work done.

The exercises closed with the National Anthem.
