King sees dark future

DALLAS, Tex. (AP) — Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. forecasts a gloomy future for the American church unless it comes to grips with racial inequality and ceases to "mouth pious irrelevancies and sanctimonious trivialities."

In Dallas to address the annual meeting of the International Convention of the Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ), King said Sunday the church must recapture its prophetic zeal or become "little more than an irrelevant social club with a thin veneer of religiosity."

At an airport news conference before the church meeting, King charged that the high proportion of Negroes among American combat troops in Viet Nam reflects "the deep pattern of discrimination in our country."

"We need to rectify this system, where only 10 per cent of the population is Negro, but 20 per cent or so of combat troops in Viet Nam are Negro," King said.

MACON, Ga. (AP) — Members of a Baptist church on the Mercer University campus have voted to dismiss their pastor and two other staff workers who had pressed for an open-door policy for Negroes.

The dismissals, approved 239 to 189 Sunday, came shortly after members of the Tattall Square Baptist Church forcibly removed from the church a Negro student from Ghana who attempted to attend the services.

The membership voted 286 to 109 last summer to remain segregated.

Pugwash salt yields find

HALIFAX (CP) — A German microbiologist reports he has isolated and cultivated living bacteria estimated to be 200,000,000 years old from rock salt samples from Pugwash, N.S.

Dr. Heinz Dombrowski of Friburg University told a meeting of the Geological and Mineralogical Associations of Canada here the significance of the research was the ability to cultivate the bacteria.

He said the bacteria were "life-stimulating" and added that six species were discovered in the Pugwash salts—five separate and one related.

Dr. Dombrowski, asked in 1962 by the Dalhousie University geology department to undertake the research, said the oldest living bacteria found so far were discovered in Siberian salts. They were estimated to be 500,000,000 years old.
