trump, and then lead a low heart. Before discussing the reasons for this sequence of plays, let's first examine the effect in the actual deal. Assume either defender wins the heart and returns a club. South ruffs it, takes one more round of trump, cashes A-K of hearts, and ruffs his fourth heart to make the slam.

Had declarer started the hand by first drawing all the adverse trumps, he would have been defeated due to the 4-2 heart break. South notes at the beginning that the contract is sure to make if the hearts are divided 3-3. His problem is to cope with a possible 4-2 break (which mathematically occurs about half the time when six cards of a suit are missing). The 5-1 break is not seriously considered, since it is unlikely the contract will make if this is the case.

Congressional Study Notes Problems In Lead And Zinc

WASHINGTON (CP) — A special congressional study mission on Canadian-American relations

suggests that stability for such basic commodities as lead and zinc be achieved through multinational negotiations rather than any bilateral arrangement between Canada and the United States. Noting that the Canadian lead and zinc industry has been depressed by recent U.S. tariff increases, the two-man team says "within the framework of NATO would be a constructive approach, whether or not immediate specific agreements are attainable."

It suggested that study of commodity problems by NATO, possibly on an industry-by-industry basis, would help develop NATO's economic potential and might well be a constructive factor in the current effort by Western European countries to set up a Common Market.

FEAR TARIFF HIKES Congressmen Frank Coffin (Dem. Me.) and Brooks Hays (Dem. Ark.), reporting on a fact-finding tour of Canada undertaken for the House of Representatives foreign affairs committee, said Canadians are afraid the U.S. will increase tariffs on other metals, particularly aluminum, copper and magnesium.

Discussing the lead and zinc tariff increases, they said the Canadians regard this action "as being arbitrary and capricious and as injuring a vital Canadian interest in order to protect marginal producers in the United States."

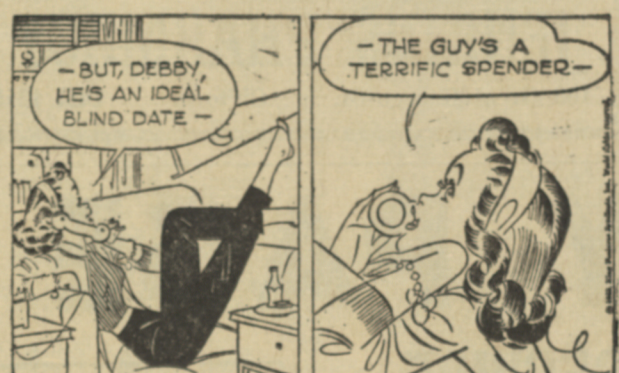

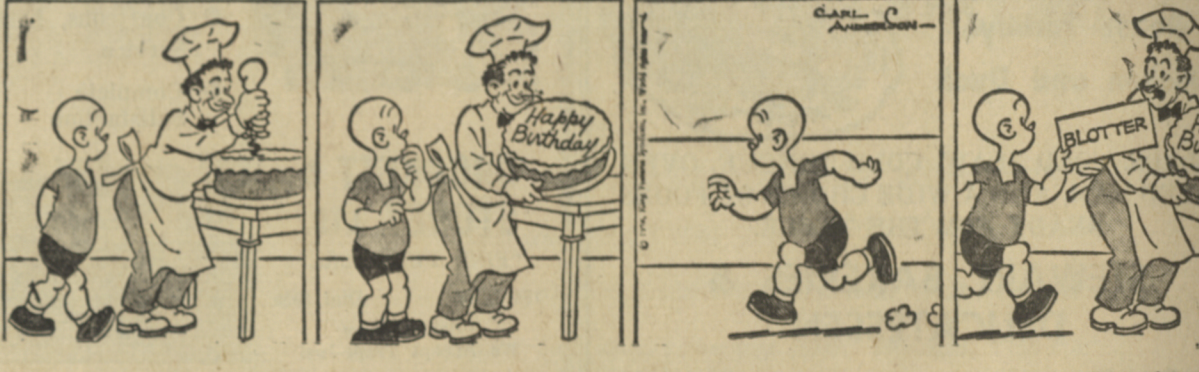

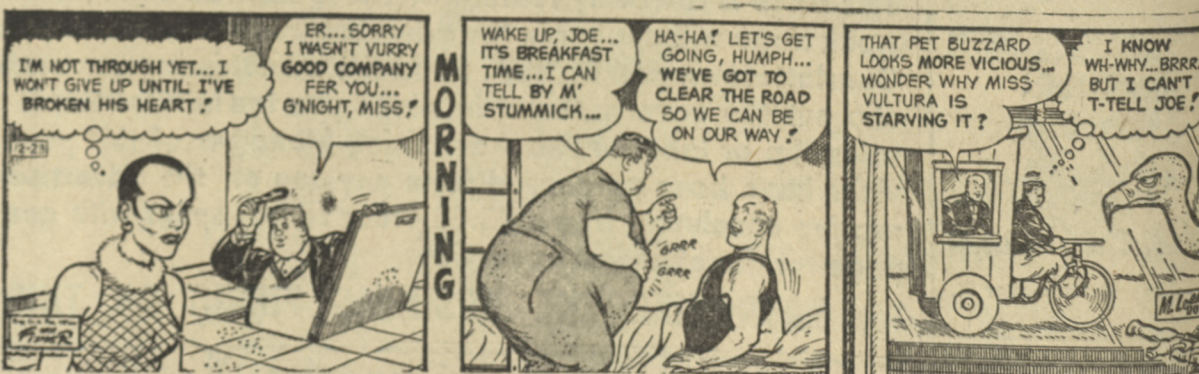
