Included in the new prizes being offered this year, the Rural Beautification Society is donating prizes to be awarded to amateur growers from the rural districts.

The purpose is to encourage rural home owners to grow flowers about their homes.

Mrs. W. H. MacKie, Summerside, is offering a prize for the best and most artistic mixed bouquet.

Fish and Game Association was held last night at Kensington with the vice president, Fred E. ... presiding.

The secretary, N. E. MacLeod ... the meeting that certain streams in the county were to be improved within the next two weeks by dynamiting holes in the stream beds to provide deep-water spots for trout.

The new Association crests were received and passed out at the meeting.

A lively discussion took place on the open seasons for migratory and upland birds for this year and the majority approved of the dates as laid down.

There was some discussion on the possibility of developing salmon angling in the county and some reports were received of these fish being caught in the Darnley River during June of this year. Some were in the 7-pound class.

Several recommendations were drawn up to be presented to the Provincial Government re stream improvement for the coming year.

The meeting recommended that the Fish and Game Association contact all school districts, poultry clubs, Farmers' Federations, etc., with a view to seeking their support in having the fox bounty increased from \$2 to \$4 this coming year.

Some discussion took place on the possibility of holding a Prince County branch sponsored field day and the decision was left in the hands of the executive.

It was decided to hold the next meeting at Borden the last Friday in August.
