Neptune Theatre Group To Appear Here Oct. 21-22

The Neptune Theatre Company of Halifax will pay its annual visit to Confederation Centre Theatre October 21 to 22 to present two plays of widely differing character.

The company will open their two day stay with William Shakespeare's Henry IV Part I, and will follow up with the comedy classic "Arsenic and Old Lace" on the second night. Both productions have attracted good audiences during Neptune's regular season this past summer.

In addition to the two evening performances, the company will also present two matinee performances of Henry IV for audiences of school children. The Shakespearean play is on the school curriculum during this term.

Henry IV has been called the story of a country rather than that of a single man. Its 40 characters encompass almost every rank and type to be found in medieval England, and the three sub-plots in the play weave together into a single story of royal responsibility and the terrible aloneness of those who accept that responsibility.

IN TITLE ROLE
The title role will be played by Roland Hewgill, a newcomer to the Neptune Company this year, and a veteran of many seasons with the Stratford Festival Company.

Paul Massie, one of Canada's most acclaimed actors will be seen as the wastrel son Prince Hal, while that medieval rogue Sir John Falstaff will be played by Ronald Bishop.

Magistrate Remands Accused

SUMMERSEDE — A local man, Joseph Emanuel Gallant entered a plea of guilty when he appeared on a charge of break and entry before Magistrate R. S. Hinton, Q.C. in Town Police Court yesterday.

Resolution Gets Support

The Island delegation's special interest in the resolution, on the convention floor at the national Liberal rally in Ottawa Tuesday night, paid dividends when the resolution received the support of the plenary session about midnight.

In his report of the results of the Island policy makers' efforts to insure this resolution of the convention support, Provincial policy chairman D. Premier Campbell expressed his deep satisfaction that the unique needs of the Island have found a special place in the national policies of the Liberal party and was especially heartened by the broad terms of the resolution which permit the federal administration the wide freedom to protect the interests of all others concerned in achieving the goal of providing the Island with constant and uninterrupted transportation and communication.

Said Cohen "... it proves that nothing is funnier than death especially when you never show it on stage... here is an engaging and lively production."

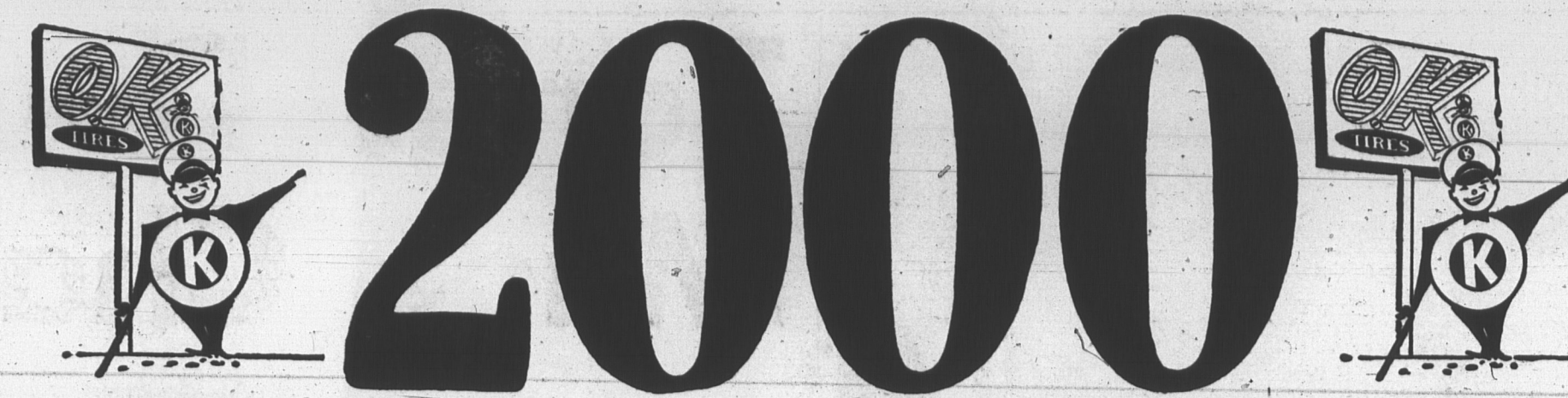
