Four students and one security officer were held for approximately one hour at knife point by a non-student.

Now two months later the Head of Security for UPEI, A.J. MacLeod denies the fact that one of his officers was a hostage in the incident but the fact is he was a hostage.

There are few official written accounts of the incident but Mr. MacLeod fails to acknowledge the information of these written documents.

Because of my personal involvement in the incident I am anxious to know what steps are being taken with regards to the person accused.

However, when I went to see Mr. MacLeod he wouldn't divulge any information about the case. He would not even disclose whether charges were still being laid.

Mr. MacLeod seemed hesitant to direct me to someone who could answer my questions. However, he later suggested that I go to the Court House.

Because I am directly involved in the case I fail to see why I am not entitled to an up date on the developments of the case.

If Security continues to ignore this incident I will not hesitate to seek outside counselling.

As Head of Security, I would assume that one of Mr. MacLeod's duties is to see that the students live in a safe environment. Apparently Mr. MacLeod and I disagree on this point.
