## Water Safety Classes Set For 105 Centres

7163 children were enrolled in Red Cross swimming and Water Safety classes in 1963. These children were enrolled in 104 different communities throughout the island. A trained staff of 88 instructors conducted the swimming classes in the various localities. Although swimming instruction is the primary function of the Red Cross Water Safety program, many varied additional services were rendered. They included:

1. The training and qualifying of National Park Lifeguards.
2. Assisting in the organization and conducting of various swim meets throughout the province.
3. Radio and television programs relating to water safety.
4. Assistance rendered to the committee conducting the Northumberland Strait swim.
5. Trained Red Cross personnel in small boats accompanied each participating swimmer.
6. Participating in the awarding of the C.R.W. Lifesaver awards.
7. An amalgamated puppet training course conducted at the Charlottetown YMCA during the summer for the children of Charlottetown and surrounding communities.
