WHEREAS the Lieutenant Governor of Her Majesty's Island of Prince Edward, with the Council and Assembly of the said Island, did, in the month of May, 1866, pass 32 Acts which have been transmitted, entitled as follows, viz :

No. 1216. "An Act for the regulation of the Militia and Volunteer Forces."

No. 1217. "An Act to prevent the concealment of Arms or Munitions of War intended for unlawful purposes."

No. 1218. "An Act for the purpose of transferring the fund raised by the sale of the Military Barracks in Charlottetown for the purposes therein mentioned."

No. 1219. "An Act to continue certain Acts therein mentioned."

No. 1222. "An Act to prevent the clandestine training of persons to the use of arms and to the practice of Military evolutions."

No. 1223. "An Act for the better security of the Crown and Government of the United Kingdom within this Island."

No. 1224. "An Act to amend the Laws relating to Elections."

No. 1225. "An Act to amend the Act entitled 'An Act for establishing a Court of Divorce in this Island, and for repealing a certain Act therein mentioned.'"

No. 1226. "An Act to amend the Act to amend the Law of Real Property."

No. 1227. "An Act to continue the Act to prevent the running at large of Hogs within the Town, Common and Royalty of Charlottetown, in so far as relates to the said Royalty."

No. 1228. "An Act to authorize the Commissioner of Highways for District Number Four, in Queen's County, to place a Gate at the Northern extremity of certain Roads therein mentioned."

No. 1229. "An Act to authorize the establishment of an additional Small Debt Court in Prince County."

No. 1230. "An Act to amend An Act to repeal the Act relating to the Oyster Fisheries in this Island, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof."

No. 1231. "An Act to continue and amend a certain Act therein mentioned."

No. 1232. An Act to carry into effect certain unexecuted agreements made by the late John Hodges Winslow, Esquire, deceased, for the sale and leasing of certain parts of his Estate in this Colony."

No. 1233. "An Act in addition to and in further amendment of the Land Purchase Act."

No. 1234. "An Act to prevent the running at large of Swine within the Town and Royalty of Princetown."

No. 1235. "An Act relating to the office of Solicitor General of this Island."

No. 1237. "An Act to exempt property belonging to Her Majesty or to the Government of this Island for duties or assessments."

No. 1240. "An Act to incorporate the Ministers and Trustees of the Presbyterian Church of Cascumpec."

No. 1241. "An Act to amend the Act relating to the Presbyterian Church at Valleyfield."

No. 1242. "An Act to amend the Act incorporating the Minister and Elders of Saint John's Church in the District of Belfast."

No. 1243. "An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the conveyance and transfer of Real and Personal property vested in Mortgages and Trustees."

No. 1244. "An Act to alter, add to, and amend the Act to incorporate the Town of Charlottetown, and the Acts in amendment thereof."

No. 1245. "An Act to incorporate the Minister and Trustees of Saint Andrew's Church, Cardigan, Township Number Fifty-three"

No. 1246. "An Act to incorporate the Minister and Trustees of Saint Andrew's Church, Brackley Point Road, Nownship Number Thirty-three."

No. 1247. "An Act to incorporate the Summerside Fishing Company."

No. 1248. "An Act to incorporate the Mechanics' Fishing Company of Charlottetown."

No. 1249. "An Act to incorporate the Charlottetown Woollen Factory Company."

No. 1250. "An Act to incorporate the Grand Lodge of British Order of Good Templars of Prince Edward Island, and to provide for the incorporation of the County and Primary Lodges in connection therewith."

No. 1251. "An Act for the regulation of Benefit Building Societies."

No. 1252. "An Act for appropriating certain monies therein mentioned for the service of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six."

And whereas the said Acts have been laid before Her Majesty in Council, together with a letter to the Lord President of the Council from the Right Honorable the Earl of Carnarvon, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, recommending that the said Acts should be left to their operation. Her Majesty was thereupon this day pleased, by and with the advice of her Privy Council, to approve the said recommendation; whereof the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander-in-Chief, for the time being, of Her Majesty's Island of Prince Edward, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
