A FOOLISH CRY!

Whether the results would be equally satisfactory here is a question to be looked into and discussed.

—How can any "Liberal" support the Government which is dependent on the vote of Pineau—who was elected to vote against it?

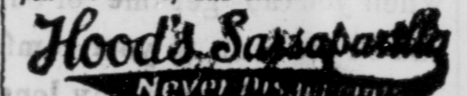
—The Guardian and the Montreal Herald want to have Mr. Tarte muzzled. These Liberal organs evidently fear the election results of the lively little minister's much speaking!

They must expect that the Liberal electors are as conscienceless as they are themselves.
