LONDON (CP) — Irish bookmakers are offering the colossal price of 1,000 to 1 against the Canadian-owned Prince D'Amour for a race to be run June 30.

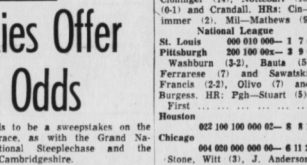
**THIS COMING SUNDAY**

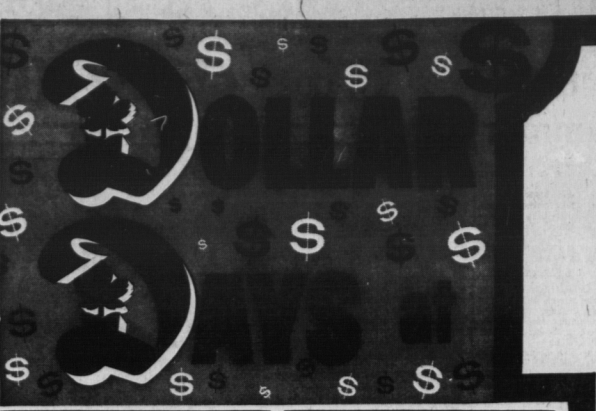
