Very Latest Telegrams.

Lucerne, Aug. 21. It having become known to the Swiss authorities that an attempt was intended upon the life of the Queen of England, during her recent sojourn in this place, a strict search was made by the police for parties concerned in the diabolical plot. To-day a man whose name is not given, but who, it is asserted, is a Fenian, was arrested and upon examination made such statements as to lead to no discovery that it was his deliberate desire to assassinate Queen Victoria. He has been committed to prison to await a requisition from the British authorities.

London, Aug. 22. A train of cars from Holywell, containing the passengers and mails from Ireland, which was proceeding towards Liverpool at the usual rate of speed, met with a bad accident to-day at the little town of Aberfeldy, in the county of Perth, a long train of loaded petroleum trucks had just been switched off on the siding to make way for the Irish mail, but the switchman had neglected to replace the switch, a dreadful collision was the consequence, seven persons, all passengers, in the mail train were killed outright, and many others badly injured. The cars on both trains were reduced to a shapeless mass. The collision produced an explosion of the petroleum which instantly enveloped both trains in flames, before the fire could be subdued eighteen persons had been literally burned to death.

London, Aug. 22. It is proper to state that the despatch announcing the intended assassination of Queen Victoria in Switzerland, by a person supposed to belong to the Fenian organization, was received through regular channels. The Foreign Office here has received no advice of the affair beyond that contained in the telegram. A Paris newspaper suggests that the subject of the Alabama claims is left to the arbitration of one of the Great Powers.

The International Yacht race off Cowes, between the American yacht 'Sappho', and four English yachts, has been postponed till Wednesday. Admiral Farragut is still at Constantinople.

New York, Aug. 21. One thousand dollars has been raised in Montreal for the entertainment of all England Eleven Cricketers.

The Royal Artillery now serving in Canada have been supplied with new heavy-loading Carabines, and Armstrong Cannon have been ordered to Dresscott and Toronto. Good opened at 144.

London, 24th. Despatches were received yesterday from parties sent from the Legation, University to make scientific observations on the total eclipse of the sun which occurred Tuesday last. These despatches are dated at Calcutta.

The sky was cloudless, and the phenomenon plainly visible throughout all India except at Bombay where rain prevented. Official despatches were received at the Foreign Office from London, 24th, giving the particulars of the story of the attempted assassination of the Queen Victoria by a Fenian. There is no truth in the report as before published. An insane Englishman, by the name of Wood, tried to enter the Queen's apartment, and was promptly taken care of.

New York, 24th. Mail advices from Europe to Aug. 13th, state that active preparations for the forthcoming Parliamentary Elections were in progress throughout Great Britain. The question is the disestablishment of the Irish Church, and the Liberals and Tories are obliged to declare for or against that measure before their constituents.

W. E. Foster, M. P. of Bradford, made a speech in which he contended that 'peace and his policy, but praised Lord Stanley's course with regard to the Alabama claims and the Naturalization question.
