TORONTO (CP) - Prices were mixed during the day but closed higher in light trading on the stock market.

The industrial index is 1.73 at 648.06, down from the all-time high of 650.14 set June 5. Gold was the only section to show a loss.

Despite the advance in index, the industrial price was confused. Papers were mixed. Albitabi up 1/4, Great Lakes Paper 1/4 and Moore Corporation down 1/4.

Alzoma advanced 1/4 and Dominion Foundries a n d Steel advanced 1/4. Amalgamated Banks were mixed to lower and financial issues and refineries were down.

Chrysler made a healthy gain of 3/4. Major down 3/4 to 3/8 and Investors' Syndicate A, off 1/4 to 3/8.

Falconbridge was ahead 1/4. Dominion 1/4. International Nickel slipped 1/4 in base metals. Dickenson declined 1/4 cents.

Among speculative mine s, Leitch made up for earlier losses, closing nine cents ahead at \$2.57. Iose up one cent to \$1.21 and Merrill dipped six cents to \$1.06.

Great Plains advanced 1/4 among senior western oil. Central Del Rio gained 1/4 cents to \$7.95.

On the foreign market, Shell Canada rose 1/4 to 18. Consolidated Paper 1/4 and Moore Corporation 1/4.

On index, industrials were ahead 1.73 to 648.06, western 1.28 to 121.15, base metals 1.19 to 216.69 and golds were down 4.0 to 91.90. Volume for the day 5,122,000 shares

HUNTING REGULATIONS 1963

Table of hunting regulations for 1963, listing game types and seasons. Includes sections for 'GAME', 'OPEN SEASONS', and 'DAILY BAG POSS.'.

LICENCE FEES

Table of licence fees for different categories of hunters and residents.

GENERAL - It is unlawful to...

- (1) hunt any game for which an open season has not been prescribed.
(2) without a shipping coupon issued by the Department of Industry and Natural Resources attached thereto, take, ship or send out of this Province any upland game bird or any furs or any package containing upland game birds, or parts thereof.
(3) buy, sell or offer to buy or sell any game except hares or rabbits.
(4) allow any hunting dog to run at large and under the control of its master, owner or trainer.
(5) disturb, molest or feed the nest or eggs of any upland game bird.
(6) hunt any upland game birds by means of any trap, cage or snare.
(7) hunt game with a rifle or other fire arm loaded with a bullet or bullets, other than rabbits, birds or other animals which the Government pays a bounty.
(8) use a pump or automatic shot gun that has a capacity of more than three shells in the magazine and chamber combined.
(9) while hunting game have more than one shot gun in personal possession.
(10) hunt or shoot on Sunday.
(11) injure or destroy the house, den or runway of any beaver, muskrat or mink.
(12) while in or on any vehicle or on horse-back, discharge or have in personal possession a loaded firearm.
(13) discharge any firearm in any locality where game is usually found between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise.
(14) set rabbit snares at the entrances to baited cubbies or circular enclosures or have in possession in the field any rabbit snares during the closed season for rabbits.
(15) hunt or trap, or trespass for the purpose of hunting or trapping game on any private or enclosed property without the consent of the owner or lessee.
(16) assign any hunting license or accept any such assignment. Each licensee shall carry his or her license when hunting and shall produce same when required by any officer or authorized to enforce the Game Regulations.
(17) willfully allow the flesh of any game suitable for food to be spoiled or destroyed.
(18) not hunt racoons at night unless he is the holder of a permit issued by the Minister specifically authorizing him to do so.
(19) during the closed season for mink or muskrat, set traps for or attempt to trap racoon, or at any time during the closed season for mink or muskrat attempt to trap racoon by the use of traps set for water.
(20) hunt or trap, or trespass for the purpose of hunting or trapping game on any private or enclosed property without the consent of the owner or lessee.
(21) willfully allow the flesh of any game suitable for food to be spoiled or destroyed.
(22) not hunt racoons at night unless he is the holder of a permit issued by the Minister specifically authorizing him to do so.
(23) during the closed season for mink or muskrat, set traps for or attempt to trap racoon, or at any time during the closed season for mink or muskrat attempt to trap racoon by the use of traps set for water.
