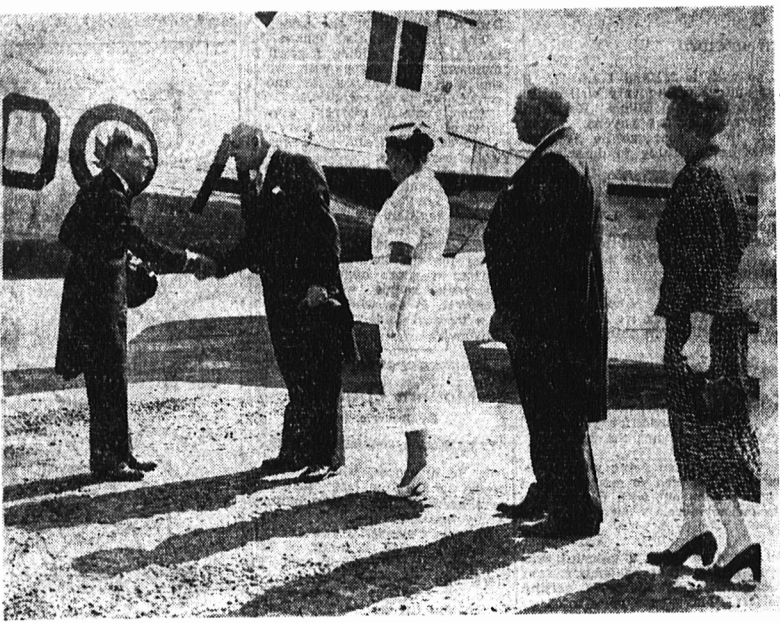
Movie Screenwriter Dies Of Heart Attack
