

# Annual Kinsmen Carnival Opens At Summerside

The annual carnival of the Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs of Summerside opened last evening at the Kinsmen Rink on Notre Dame Street with a variety of attractions that fill the entire area of the rink in gaiety and numbers that will provide amusement and entertainment for the hundreds of people who will visit the carnival which continues tonight, Friday and Saturday nights.

Coupled with the carnival attractions is a wild-life exhibit of special mention, presented by a caged collection of live birds, animals and fish, which are observed at such close range as is made possible at the Kinsmen carnival.

The carnival was officially opened by Mayor Henry W. Wedge who stated that the Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs were real assets to the town as a whole, and particularly to the youth.

He complimented them on the splendid equipment and wading pools they have provided for the two playgrounds, and on good job their Halloween party did in keeping the children off the streets on that evening. He concluded by expressing the hope that citizens would attend in large numbers to support the work being done by the clubs.

The proceeds of the carnival are used for service work in Summerside. Last year the Kinsmen Club spent about \$3,000.00 on its various community service projects, some of which have included outfitting the playground on Notre Dame Street with wading pools and facilities similar to what they had given the previous year to the playground in Queen Elizabeth Park.

Other Kinsmen projects included the sponsoring of the children's Halloween party; the Kinsmen Christmas tree from which parcels are distributed to every needy family in Summerside; a toy ma-

trials which provides toys to the children at the two orphanages; assistance to little league baseball, and the sponsoring of a team in this league; providing a public address system with speakers in every classroom for the High School and convent, and to assist in the work of the Kinsmen and Kinette Clubs by attending and supporting the carnival.

In addition to 19 booths which provide everything from bingo to refreshments, the wild life exhibit, set in a background that resembles the open woods, features a display which includes silver and platinum foxes, geese, ducks, Canada wild geese, ragoon, skunk (decorated), mink, golden pheasants, chukkar partridge, Hungarian partridge, ring-neck pheasants, sparrow hawk, crow, quail, bantam hens, an exhibit of speckled trout, etc.

Previous to and also at the conclusion of the official opening of the carnival, lively hand music was provided by the Summerside Sea Cadet Band under the direction of Bandsmaster Gabriel Chlason. The door prize of \$25 was won by Keir Duggan of Kensington.

# Dr. Dunton

It is a worthwhile thing to belong to a country such as Canada and I am sure we all agree that we can do something distinctive to keep Canada Canadian.

Our determination to be a nation stems from what has been accomplished not from what has been said," he continued. And just as we have made decisions as to what to be done in the past, we must make decisions now regarding broadcasting and how it will be developed.

In reviewing the history of radio broadcasting, Dr. Dunton paid tribute to the early pioneer radio stations with particular reference to the late Col. K. S. Rogers.

MUCH CONCERNED

Dr. Dunton said that with the establishment of large numbers of independent stations throughout the country, there was expressed that such a system would tend to destroy our national identity. "Some believed that broadcasting should be done by one national network, but after discussing the matter in a democratic Canadian manner it was agreed that privately owned stations had a place and a right to do commercial broadcasting while at the same time serving as an outlet for many of the National programs," he said.

SECOND DECISION

With the advent of television other important decisions had to be made. It was felt by the CBC Board of Governors that television must be developed so that it would serve the Nation. He defended the accusation that the CBC was "dragging its feet", stating that they have developed faster in the last three years than any other country in the world.

He said there were 28 television stations across Canada serving one and a-half million families in 85 per cent of the country's area. "This service will grow as Prince Edward Island is added," said Dr. Dunton, who observed that half of the programs carried on the network were Canadian and half American. He noted at the same time that there was more program production going on in Canada than in any other country outside of the United States.

TELEVISION OPPOSITION

"I am sure there are many people—and mostly among the better thinking people—who say, 'Television is not coming into my home it may be all right for my neighbour, but it is not for us'. The fact of the matter is, it is not part of our job to sell television to anyone, whether a person has a television set or not. They can't ignore what is going on in this country because it is going to affect our lives whether we own a set or not."

The speaker felt that television should convey ideas and information that are cultural and worthwhile. He took strong exception to the contention that television was the means of detracting from the habit of reading. In support of his argument he cited the recent broadcast of Shakespeare's "MacBeth", noting that it had been brought by this means to one and a-half million families who had an opportunity to hear and witness the play. He wondered on the other hand how many people had read Shakespeare during the last week.

Dr. Dunton said that it was impossible to put up a wall to prevent progress reaching our citizens. "It is not so important to consider the negative aspect of the matter as it is to deal with positive side," he said.

THE COST

The CBC Chairman estimated that a nation-wide television service would cost each family in the vicinity of \$15 a year or about 10 cents a day. He said that the service now being more than taken care of by the excise tax on new television sets sold. He pointed out, however, that the sales would tend to decrease as more and more people became owners of sets and again a problem would have to be confronted.

Dr. Dunton did not venture to predict what the solution for this problem of the future would be, but suggested that it would probably be decided by Royal Commission. "One thing certain is that if Canadians wish any real measure of communication they must take the initiative, otherwise we will be consumers rather than producers."

In closing, Dr. Dunton expressed confidence that the many stations engaged in this work so far, will be capable of carrying out the future requirement wants of the country.
