Appeal Is Disallowed In S'ide On Public Intoxication Count

SUMMERSIDE — An appeal was disallowed in Supreme Court at Summerside yesterday in the case of William J. Taylor, RCMP Station 10.

The Queen heard from Mr. Justice Mark R. McGuigan. The appellant was convicted by Magistrate R. S. Hinton, CP, in town police court two months ago on a charge of public intoxication at Summerside. The charge was laid Sept. 1.

Cst. Stewart Berry testified that accused and a companion were standing in the doorway of Civic Stadium on the night of Aug. 31 during a dance held there. It was about 12.30 a.m. and the two were attempting to get into the hall for the regular fare. When asked to move, Cst. Berry, accused both and was asked to leave the building. Accused told Cst. Berry he would not so unless charged. The police officer then charged him with public intoxication, he testified.

Cst. Berry stated accused had a strong smell of alcohol from his breath and staggered on his feet when proceeding to the jail from the police car.

Cst. Neil Sharp testified he was present when Cst. Berry accused's speech was thick; he had a strong smell of alcohol from his breath and was not steady on his feet when walking from the patrol car to the jail.

Appellant gave evidence on his own behalf. He said he was only "drunk" on the night in question and that he was not drunk or steady on his feet and he had no idea of the amount of liquor consumed.

Steve Semlinik, companion of the appellant, testified that Taylor was drinking with him at the RCMP station and that he was not drunk or steady on his feet and he had no idea of the amount of liquor consumed.

Defence counsel J. Watson MacNaught, QC, stated there was no clear cut definition of "intoxication" whereby to make a distinction of the appellant's condition.

President Abdullah Sallal, leader of Yemen's armed forces said the army is standing alert along the frontier, and that aggressors an unforgettable lesson," the United Arab Republic radio in Cairo reported.

BOSTON (AP) — A British insurance firm which made good the \$129,000 robbery from the Boston Professional Hockey arena has been awarded the \$54,548 of the loot that was recovered.

Suffolk County Superior Court Judge Felix Forte has ruled that the Commercial Union Assurance Company Limited of London, which insured the American firm against robbery, should get the money.

Forte said the FBI would be allowed to retain \$10,000 — 10 disintegrating \$1,000 bills from the loot — for use in the Museum of Crime in Washington.

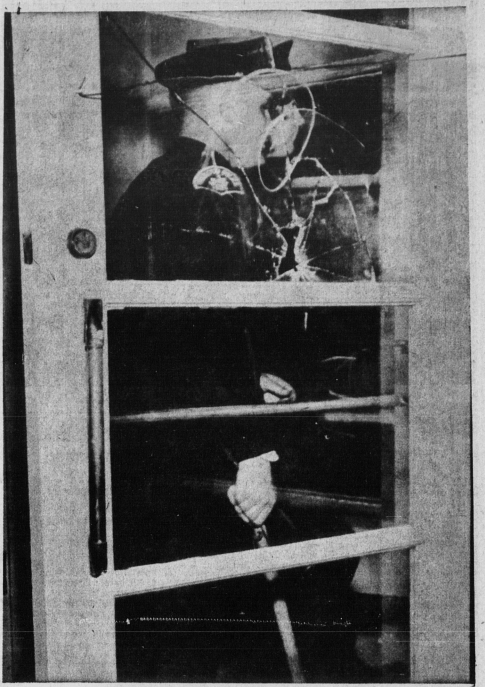
