His Appearances Documented

Christian religion is the only one which sets aside a day to celebrate this victory, occurring in the person of Jesus Christ.

This victory of Christ was documented by His appearances to the disciples and others after His burial. Perhaps the most important of these appearances

The "mountain" referred to in this passage is thought to have been no specific hill, but rather the high ground above the Sea of Galilee.

The passage from 1 Corinthians mentions six appearances of Christ—to Cephas (Peter); to "the twelve" (actually, about eleven, since Judas had died); probably the appearance mentioned in Mark 16:1-4; Luke 24:36-43 and John 20:19-23, occurring on Easter night; to the 500 (about which we have no details); to James (believed to be the Lord's brother), and again to all the apostles (see Acts 1:3-9).
