Deported Without Overcoat, Charges He Was Kidnapped

HELSINKI, Finland (AP)—William Heikkila arrived without an overcoat in a sleet storm Tuesday and charged that U.S. immigration officers kidnapped him and deported him to Finland as a Communist.

The 56-year-old Finnish draftsman vowed he will fight to return to the United States, telling reporters: "I regard it as my home country."

Heikkila was born here of naturalized American parents and went to the United States when he was 2 1/2 months old. He never was naturalized.

He wore only a light blue summer suit and no hat when he stepped from the plane at Helsinki airport into the cold and sleet. He had no luggage and said he was not even given time to see his wife or get a toothbrush when he was picked up in a San Francisco street Friday and flown to Helsinki by way of Vancouver.

15 Appear On Police Court Docket Tuesday

Two Charlottetown men appeared before Magistrate K.M. Martin in City Police Court yesterday for a preliminary hearing. They are charged with break enter and theft from Keith MacKinnon's warehouse.

Three crown witnesses were heard in the case that was adjourned until Thursday, April 24.

The morning docket was heavy with 14 men and one woman appearing on charges ranging from the above to being drunk and disorderly.

Four men were apprehended by police officers at about five o'clock yesterday morning on the corner of Euston and Queen Streets. One of the men, a 35-year-old Cumberland Street man, was booked on a drunken driving charge but pleaded guilty to a reduced charge of driving while impaired. He was fined \$100 and costs or 20 days.

The other three men were charged with being drunk and incapable. They were fined \$15 and costs or 10 days each.

A King Street man and a 59-year-old resident of Great George Street were sentenced to 10 days each in Queens County Jail when they were convicted of being drunk and incapable. Other drunk and incapable charges drew a Union Street man and a woman resident of Dorchester Street fines of \$10 and costs or five days.

An 18-year-old city youth was convicted of a charge of vagrancy. He pleaded not guilty to the charge.

Two King's county men, one from Alliston and the other from Sturgeon, charged with being drunk and disorderly, were mandated until Friday, April 25.

A fine of \$20 and costs were levied against two city men arising out of an incident on Monday night at Johnny's Fish and Chips. One man was charged with obstructing a police officer and the other of being drunk and disorderly.

Is Remanded On Robbery Charge

PORT HOOD, N.S. (CP)—Russell Ross, 41, of Florence, N.S., was remanded for one week Tuesday when he appeared for preliminary hearing on a charge of armed robbery in connection with last week's daring holdup of a railway mail car.

Ross was charged after two mail clerks on the overnight Halifax - Sydney Express were locked in a washroom at gunpoint and the car ransacked of 35 packages of registered mail. The loot included \$10,000 worth of stamps which police said weighed 45 pounds.

Ross was arrested at Bucklaw, about 15 miles from the railway in central Cape Breton, a day after an armed bandit boarded the mail car at Port Hawkesbury, first stop on the Cape Breton side of the Canso causeway. The bandit was believed to have left the train sometime after it stopped at Orangedale, about 30 miles from Port Hawkesbury. All the loot has been recovered.

The hearing was postponed at the request of the Crown. Ross was not represented by a lawyer when he appeared before Magistrate Duncan Chisholm.

Tells Cause Of Trouble On N. S. Highways

HALIFAX (CP)—Highways Minister Smith said Tuesday breakups on the highway from Truro to the Canso Causeway appear to have resulted from the causes.

"The two main reasons were the nature of the winter and the age of pavement and in some cases lack of grading underneath it," Mr. Smith said. He was replying to questions of Peter M. Nicholson (L - Annapolis West).

Mr. Nicholson said he understood there had been extensive damage to provincial highways and asked what plans the government had for reconstruction.

Mr. Smith said trouble on 10-13 miles of road on the Antigonish side of New Glasgow was caused by lack of sub-grading and old pavement. "It is a recurrence of perennial trouble."

The Minister said that because alternate Trans-Canada Highway routes were available he wondered if large expenditures on reconstruction were necessary. Some breakups in Trans-Canada Highway pavement resulted because the final coat of asphalt had not been laid.

Mr. Nicholson asked if anyone had suggested salt was to blame. Mr. Smith said it was mentioned "by some members of the public" but not by any members of the Highways Department.

Is Remanded On Robbery Charge

PORT HOOD, N.S. (CP)—Russell Ross, 41, of Florence, N.S., was remanded for one week Tuesday when he appeared for preliminary hearing on a charge of armed robbery in connection with last week's daring holdup of a railway mail car.

Ross was charged after two mail clerks on the overnight Halifax - Sydney Express were locked in a washroom at gunpoint and the car ransacked of 35 packages of registered mail. The loot included \$10,000 worth of stamps which police said weighed 45 pounds.

Ross was arrested at Bucklaw, about 15 miles from the railway in central Cape Breton, a day after an armed bandit boarded the mail car at Port Hawkesbury, first stop on the Cape Breton side of the Canso causeway. The bandit was believed to have left the train sometime after it stopped at Orangedale, about 30 miles from Port Hawkesbury. All the loot has been recovered.

The hearing was postponed at the request of the Crown. Ross was not represented by a lawyer when he appeared before Magistrate Duncan Chisholm.
