The mad and merry Marx Brothers, Harpo, Chico and Groucho, will be with us again today when their current romp, "Love Happy," bows in at the Prince Edward Theatre through United Artists release. Lester Cowan, best known for his "Story of GI Joe," based on the famous Ernie Pyle war columns, takes his first venture into the realm of comedy with this film and comes off with one of the sprightliest, earliest bits of screen fare to come out of Hollywood this season.
