solute beauty. The five Samoyede dogs created much comment as they lay in the snow at the front of the float.

The first float in the parade was the work of Mr. J. Maddigan of Moore and MacLeod Ltd., and presented a picture of charm and beauty which made it outstanding. Representing a corner of a flower garden, it also carried some of the contestants from the Miss P. E. I. contest.

Town Taxi ingeniously decorated the top of their car so that it held a little lad driving a toy automobile at the front, and a very young lady answering telephone calls for a taxi at the rear.

Bathing beauties were featured on the float by W. R. Jenkins, and although it was thought they might be cold at the beginning of the parade when the wind started, they certainly did not worry about their costumes when it rained, a little later.

"Cradle of Confederation", one of the more elaborate floats in the parade, was the work of F. W. Woolworth, and presented in a novel manner the historical aspects of this Province's background. Jeweller for Four Generations, an outstanding feature of the parade was a barouche, drawn by a party of three in costume, with two coachmen sitting up front, the wicker barouche is believed to be the only one of its type in the Maritimes.

Made about 1875, it was brought to this Province in the early nineties, from Piquay, Ohio, by Colonel Orr, and is now the property of G. H. Taylor.

Santa made a special trip to Charlottetown to appear on the float of R. T. Holman Co. Ltd., and will no doubt be receiving a lot of early mail as a result. Silvered evergreen trees and snow balls made a lovely setting for Santa and his prancing reindeer, and younger members of the watchers longed for the parade to begin in order that they might get a better look at their favorite in the white whiskers.

Atkinson's Groceria featured a garden swing on their entry, and Michael Brothers showed the "Teddy Bear Picnic." Miss Studebaker was a charming young miss whose red and white skirt completely covered the automobile on which she was riding.
