

# Bobby Dowling Fires 68 For Seven Stroke Lead

Making a strong bid to retain his N.E.-P.E.I. Open Golf Championship title, Bobby Dowling played the afternoon with the 12 top amateurs and 8 pros taking part.

Combined with a 73 score on the first day Dowling's 68 left him with 141, seven strokes better than his nearest rival Bathurst pro Peter Kelly at 148 (74-74).

Monday's pacemakers Island amateur Derwyn Huestis a d Moncton pro Alan Ogilvie slipped back in the pack. Huestis slid from a par 72 to 79 yesterday while Ogilvie dropped 8 strokes to an 80 for a score of 150.

While Dowling pulled away from the other entrants a red-hot fight for the three vacant positions on the Willingdon Cup team is in the making.

Charlottetown amateur Art MacKenzie and G.J. (Pete) Campbell vaulted into the lead tied with 149s. MacKenzie had 3 strokes off Monday's score with a 73 and Campbell edged his earlier round by a stroke for a 74.

However there are at least eight other golfers who will have something to say before the final 36 holes are completed today. Breathing down the leaders' respective necks are Don MacDonald of Charlottetown and one stroke back at 150, P. Mavor of Edmundston and Derwyn Huestis with 151; Pud Beer and Jack Beaton of Charlottetown at 152 and Moncton golfers R.H. Harley and Doug Lewis with 153.

# Machen To Go Against Bob Baker In Chicago Tonight

CHICAGO (AP) — Undefeated Eddie Machen, winner of 21 consecutive pro bouts, risks his high heavyweight ranking against dangerous Bob Baker at the Chicago Stadium Wednesday night.

The bout which will be televised nationally could be a clincher in Machen's bid for a shot at Floyd Patterson's heavyweight title. Machen, 25-year-old San Francisco protege of Sid Flaherty, who managed former middleweight champion Carl (Bobo) Olson, is ranked No. 2 contender behind Tommy (Hurricane) Jackson in ratings of both the National Boxing Association and Ring Magazine.

As Machen, a 3-1 choice, brushes aside the bulky, but agile Baker, it will be hard for the winner of next Monday night's title bout between Patterson and Jackson to dodge a challenge by the west coast beller.

# San Francisco Has Best Chance

NEW YORK (AP) — George Christopher, mayor of San Francisco, said Monday he feels the Giants baseball club is "irretrievably lost to New York City," and San Francisco "has a 90 per cent chance of getting" the club.

"I feel that if I have not a signed document in 30 days, the matter will be finalized beyond my control," he said.

He spoke briefly with reporters at La Guardia field.

Asked if he thought the possibility was now stronger than ever for the Giants to move to San Francisco, he said, "I think the Giants are irretrievably lost to New York City. I would say San Francisco has a 90 per cent chance of getting the Giants. Other cities have a 10 per cent chance."

Asked what other cities he had in mind, he said, "It might be Minneapolis." He mentioned no others.

# Kennedy Now With Detroit

DETROIT (AP) — Detroit Red Wings and Chicago Black Hawks have completed a six-player-trade that will send veteran left winger Ted Lindsay and goalie Glenn Hall to the Hawks for four players and a considerable sum of cash.

Red Wings officials declined either to confirm or deny the trade, biggest of the off-season, but it was learned from an unimpeachable source that all arrangements have been completed.

The Red Wings, many times National Hockey League champions and runner-up to Montreal Canadiens last season, are to receive left wing Johnny Wilson, centre Forbes Kennedy, goalie Hank Bassen, and defenceman Bill Press-ton.

Lindsay, 31, the highest-scoring left wing in professional hockey history, had insisted that he would never agree to a trade nor play for any team other than the Red Wings.

It is known that Lindsay had agreed to Chicago terms before the trade was consummated. Kennedy, 21, was regarded as one of the leading rookies in the NHL last season when he scored eight goals and 13 assists in his first year in the salaried ranks.
