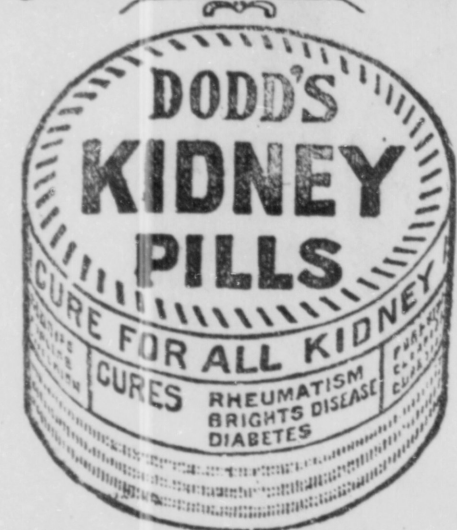

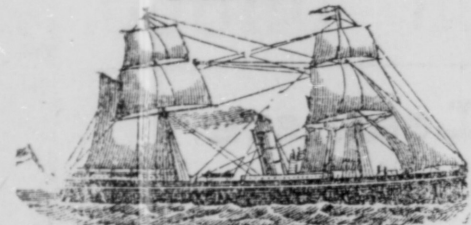

The Transvaal War

The Zulu Tribe.

A good deal of interest is felt concerning the movement of the Zulus: Zululand contains a population of 178,000, of which only 1,000 are whites, mainly officials, missionaries, and traders. There are two distinct factions in Zululand, the followers of the Usutu party acknowledging Dinuzulu as their leader, and the Umahlakazi, headed by Usibepu. The Usutu remnants of Cetewayo's men were afterwards defeated by Usibepu, and thereupon they called to their aid certain Boer adventurers from the Transvaal, who put Usibepu to rout. For their services the Boers received what is now known as the New Republic. In 1889 Dinuzulu was found guilty of high treason, and sentenced to ten years' imprisonment at St. Helena. He has now returned to Zululand, and is in receipt of an allowance from Natal of \$2,500 a year. Usibepu, who has been in Zululand, ever since the war, is one of the 13 kinglets appointed after the fall of Cetewayo. He is a scion of the royal Zulu house, and has infinitely more prestige and authority than his convict rival. He possesses the reputation of being the best fighting general in Zululand. These two chiefs, it must be remembered, control the movements of a force more than three times the number of an English army corps, and their attitude at present is of infinite importance to England's position in South Africa. The general attitude of the Zulu to the Boer is one of undying hostility, for the Dutch have systematically, in the past, adopted methods of dealing with the native races which have provoked nothing but enmity and hatred. No doubt the older Zulus have a deep-rooted respect for the British army, but the younger men may be inclined to sit on the fence. Hence while it is most likely the Zulus will help the English, they may, in turn, aid the Boers. This uncertainty is keeping both sides guessing.

Plan of Attack.

A press despatch purports to give some details of the British plan of campaign in South Africa, relative to the place of landing troops and the line of advance upon the Boers," says the New York Tribune. "According to this announcement, the troops about to start for South Africa will not be landed at Cape Town, nor at Durban but in the neighborhood of Algoa Bay—to wit, at Port Elizabeth, Port Alfred and East London. The reason given is that Cape Town and Durban are already overcrowded with refugees. That is doubtless true. But there are other reasons.

Cape Town is too far from the seat of war. It is 575 miles from Cape Town to the frontier on the Orange River, and 1040 miles to Pretoria. And the railroad at and beyond the Orange river, has been destroyed by the Boers. Durban is nearest of all to the seat of war. It is only a 180 miles from Ladysmith and 11 from Pretoria. But to get from it through Natal into either the Orange State or the Transvaal it is necessary to cross the steep and lofty Drakensberg, the passes of which are already in the hands of the Boers. There remains the third course, by way of the Algoa Bay route. One railway runs from Port Elizabeth right up to Bloemfontein and Pretoria, with a branch to De Aar on the Cape Town-Kimberley-Bulawayo line. Another runs from East London up to the Port Elizabeth line just beyond the Orange river, with a branch from

Burghersdorp to Aliwal North, on the Orange frontier. And a third runs from Port Alfred (formerly Marthurst) between these two, connecting with them both, at Rosmead and at Stormberg. Here, then, are three railroad lines, all in British hands, ready to convey troops straight to the Orange frontier at three points, Norval's Point, 328 miles; Bethule, 320 miles, and Aliwal North, 300 miles from the coast.

From these points the advance will be easy. There will be no Drakensberg to cross, but only the Orange river. Then they will be on the open plains of the Orange State, with Bloemfontein only 125 miles away, and Pretoria 290 miles beyond. An advance in that direction would give the British their own choice of ground for fighting upon. And it would in the surest and quickest manner compel the Boers to call in their troops from Natal, Bechuanaland, and Griqualand, for the defence of their own capitals. If this shall indeed prove to be the British plan, as now seems most probable, the Orange alliance will prove to be a serious handicap to the Transvaal, in as much as it will open the easiest and directest road from the coast to Pretoria. Had the Orange Free State remained neutral Sir Redvers Buller would have had to fight his way over the Drakenberg or up the long road through Griqualand, and then give battle on the Boers' chosen ground. In casting in its with the Transvaal the Orange Free State has facilitated the ruin of the Transvaal and has involved itself in that ruin." The advance cannot be through Delagoa Bay as that is the territory of a neutral power.

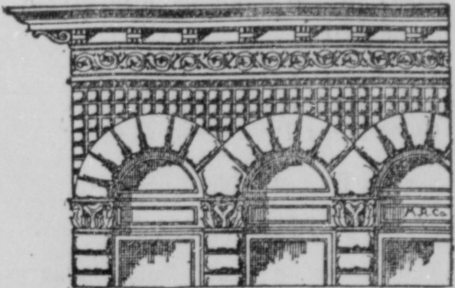
