

Diphtheria in St. John's, Nfld.

THERE HAVE BEEN 2,671 CASES AND 503 DEATHS—THE DISEASE IN 1,200 FAMILIES.

The Colonist says: Head Constable Winslow is sanguine in the belief that at last the bard of health has got the proper grip on diphtheria, and that if a few more fine days follow, the last case will have been heard of. There has been no new house placarded since Thursday last, and only two new cases reported, and those from an old house. Now that the epidemic has all but disappeared, it may not be interesting to give the number of cases, etc. According to the head constable's "little book," then, there were 2,671 cases of diphtheria since the beginning of the outbreak; of this number 603 died. The number of families in which the outbreak appeared was slightly over 1,200. Assuming that there are 6,000 families in town (and it is safe to place the number at that figure), it will be seen that one-fifth of the families in town had diphtheria in their houses. It has been stated by some of the doctors that a large percentage of the cases reported were not really diphtheria at all, but some other form of throat disease. However, it was an error on the right side to isolate all suspicious cases, and an excess of caution is more worthy of praise than an excess of carelessness.

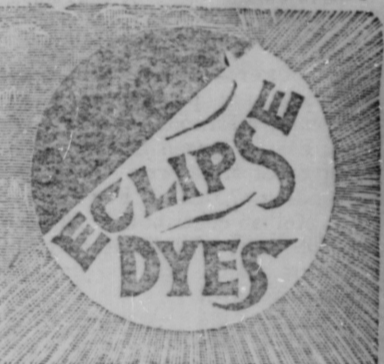
