

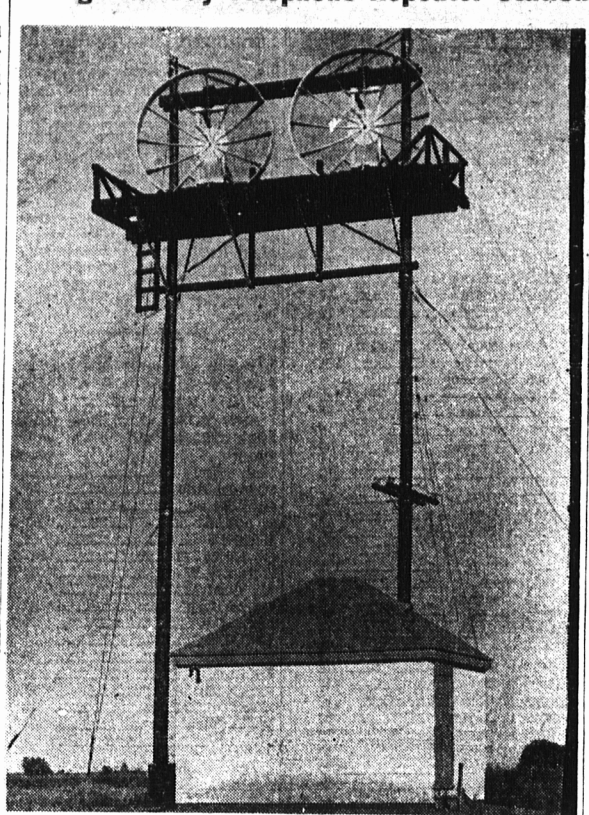

Egmont Bay Telephone Repeater Station



The sending and receiving of telephone messages on radio waves through the air is the purpose of the installation seen above. It is the new telephone repeater station at Egmont Bay. In outlining the technical construction of this station, Mr. E. G. Cameron, plant superintendent at Charlottetown, said the small building contains the transmitting and receiving equipment, and emergency power unit which will permit the station to keep operating in the event of a power failure. The two circular parabolic reflectors are each 10 feet in diameter. They are constructed of reinforced 1-inch water resistant ply-wood, supported by ribs. The back is covered with copper wire mesh which reflects the radio beam to the di-pole (antenna) in the center of each reflector. As viewed in the photo, the left reflector is used for transmitting and the right is used for receiving. The antennae are connected to the equipment in the building, by lines coming down the side of the poles. The tower is protected from lightning by rods placed at the top of each pole. The poles are crosscut Douglas fir, 65 feet in length. The bottom of the tower is 35 feet from the ground, and its dimensions are 25 x 9. At present two 2-way circuits are in operation to Moncton, and one to Saint John; and others will be placed in operation when required.
