INSECTS

The agriculturalist has little concern of the losses he sustains through the activities of mosquitoes and flies. Animals tormented by flies waste and lose condition, they feed and work in discomfort and so fail to fatten or milk as they should.

These are sometimes responsible for transmitting miasmas or germs. HORSE STOMACH WORMS The common stable fly may irritate, with its biting mouth parts, a horse with the germs of disease or with the immature forms of a stomach worm which fly harbours in its own body.

FLIES AND dirt go together, therefore, keep the buildings scrupulously clean - especially the dark and dusty corners.

GLASS WINDOWS Flies dislike buildings which are brightly and well lighted. Flies like plenty of white light but shun blue light; if the ordinary window glass is replaced with one tinted glass or smeared, in summer, with whitening coloured with washing blue, this will help - with regular disinfection and spraying - to keep the flies out of the buildings.

WASTE FOODSTUFFS Do not leave uncovered waste foodstuffs or dead matter in odd corners for flies to breed upon. Collect and bury any dead rats and mice or other vermin carcasses. Spray refuse heaps daily.

MANURE Do not leave small heaps of manure around the buildings. Flies will not lay their eggs on the outside of well-dried manure heaps. Dung should be closely packed and each addition to the heap should be buried in the centre, and old dung being well patted down on top of it with a shovel.

Surprisingly Uniform Tire Price Increases

OTTAWA (CP)—CCF member A. M. Nicholson asked the government to investigate what he termed a surprisingly uniform increase in the price of tires and tubes by three Ontario rubber companies.

The member for Mackenzie suggested in the Commons that the price boosts should be considered by the restrictive trade practices commission.

Justice Minister Garson was not in the House but Finance Minister Harris said Mr. Nicholson's question would be taken as notice.

Mr. Nicholson referred to a Toronto report that Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co. next week will increase the price of tires and tubes by 2 1/2 to 7 1/2 per cent.

The report said similar increases probably will be announced by Seiberling Rubber Co. and Dunlop of Canada.
