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LATEST NEWS SUMMARY.

EUROPEAN. The French elections are fixed for the 20th of December. It is expected that the Carlist army in Catalonia will soon surrender.

BRITISH. The upward tendency in the English corn market is checked and made inactive. Negotiations between the British and Chinese Governments are progressing satisfactorily.

CANADIAN. Mr. Latyve, in charge of the Fisheries Protection Service in the Gulf of St. Lawrence, informs the Fisheries Department at Ottawa that contrary to the experience of previous years, great abundance of codfish prevailed at the Magdalen Islands, and herring and mackerel were struck in large quantities on the 18th and 19th inst.

This number is of more than usual interest, as it contains several articles having relation to subjects now attracting a good share of attention in this country. The first article explains the many and various duties of the police magistrates of London, and narrates a few of the incidents that occur the police courts. The jurisdiction of the magistrates has of late years been largely extended, and in numerous cases he has the power of deciding summarily.

The report of Messrs. Dunn, Wiman & Co., for the first nine months of the present year shows that the total failures in the United States for nine months have been 5,334 in number, representing liabilities of \$131,172,596. In Canada the number in the same period has been 1,249 representing \$2,011,544.

It appears that the catch of fish on the Newfoundland and Labrador coasts this year does not amount to more than half that of the previous year, and it is feared that there will be considerable distress among the fishermen in consequence. A bad harvest or a dullness in trade is generally regarded as a matter over which nobody has any control, and most people would be apt to put a bad season's fishing in the same category. But it seems that it is not so, and that a little enterprise among the Cod-fishermen would tend to prevent a recurrence of the misfortune.
