MRS. OLIVIA A. MACDONALD

On Saturday evening April 8th, 1950, the death occurred at the P. E. I. Hospital of Mrs. Olivia A. MacDonald in her 49th year. Mrs. MacDonald was the daughter of the late Joseph and Melissa (White) Foss of Machias, Maine, U. S. A., and came to the island in 1930, when she married the late Mr. Wm. F. Campbell of Montague. After the death of Mr. Campbell she was remarried to Mr. John A. MacDonald of Iris, P. E. I., who is employed in Charlottetown. Besides her husband there are left to mourn the loss of an ever kind and loving mother, three daughters, Melissa, Mrs. Lewis Yorlton of Rosemeath, P. E. Solos sung by Mr. Preston Beck were "The Stranger of Galilee" and "The Old Rugged Cross". The Montague Church Choir under the direction of Mrs. MacLure sang "Rock of Ages" and "Tread Softly." In words of fitting comfort and encouragement Rev. Mr. Dunbar chose his remarks from Luke 12, using chiefly the thought "Mary hath chosen the better part." The church was well filled with friends and neighbours who had come to pay their last respects. The many flowers were beautiful. Sincere sympathy is extended to the family in their loss.
