

# Armstrong Leads Leafs To Win Over Detroit

TORONTO, (CP)—Two goals by George Armstrong Saturday night gave Toronto Maple Leafs a 4-1 victory over the leading Detroit Red Wings in a National Hockey League game.

A fluke goal by Detroit in the late stages of the third stanza robbed goalie Harry Lumley of his ninth shutout.

After a rough first period that saw 10 penalties handed out, six of them to Leafs, left-winger Harry Watson opened the scoring at 15:39 of the second when he took a pass from Tod Sloan at the blue line, manoeuvred his way through the Detroit defence and drove a sizzling shot past a sprawling Terry Sawchuk.

Armstrong threw Detroit defencemen Marcel Pronovost and Bob Goldham into a state of confusion as he faked his way into the net and drilled a hard shot past Sawchuk at 6:32 of the third period.

A string of third-period penalties caused Wings' downfall. Johnny Wilson was sent off for hooking and Marty Pavelich for slashing. Sid Smith took advantage of Wings' two-man shortage to score at 10:32. Stewart was given an assist. Just as Wilson was returning to the ice Armstrong scored his second goal of the night and his 15th of the season when he took a Sloan-Jim Thomson relay.

Lumley's shutout was spoiled at 14:15. His view was blocked by Jim Morrison and Pavelich standing in front of the net. A relay to Tony Leswich from Glen Skov deflected off Pavelich's stick and dribbled into the net.

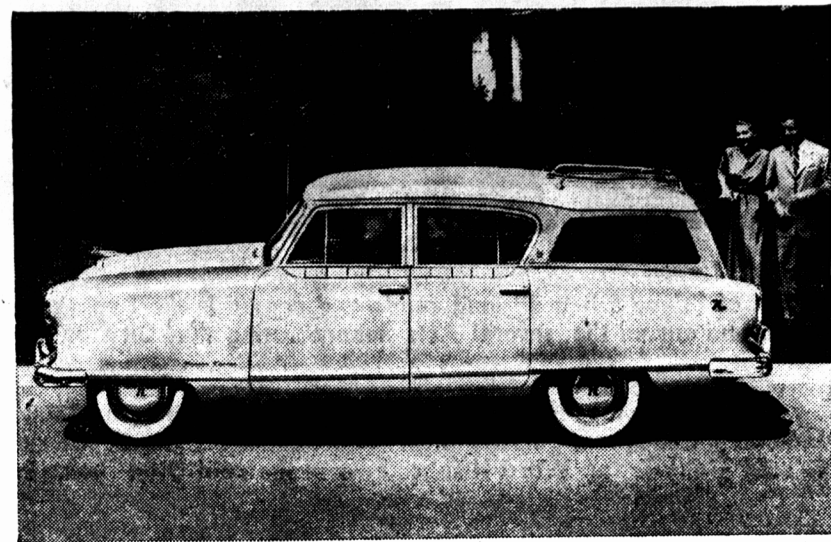

# Ban On Shorts In Golf Rescinded

NEW YORK, (AP)—Shorts again are legal for competitors in women's tournaments sponsored by the United States Golf Association.

The ban on shorts was rescinded by delegates to the annual meeting of the USGA Saturday. It was passed a year ago but had not been enforced since the 1953 women's amateur tournament at Providence, R. I., last summer.

"I hope," sighed Totten P. Hefelfinger, retiring president, "that this settles—forever—what women golfers may wear during a tournament."

The delegates also voted to reduce the number of automatic qualifiers for the United States open, starting in 1955, and increasing the number of qualifying places in the sectional tournaments. Starting next year, only the winners of the previous five U. S. opens will be admitted to title play without qualifying. In previous years all previous open winners were admitted.

# Geoffrion In Hat-Trick As Canadiens Win 5-1

MONTREAL, (CP)—Bernie (Boom-Boom) Geoffrion pulled off the hat-trick Saturday night, the ebullient right-winger's three goals leading Montreal Canadiens to a 5-1 victory over Chicago Black Hawks in a National Hockey League game.

Geoffrion's feat ran his string to a 24 for the season, two behind teammate Maurice Rocket Richard who scored Montreal's final goal.

Veteran centre Elmer Lach, in a dazzling display, figured in all Montreal goals, scoring one and counting four assists to run his all-time assists total to 403. Rookie Lou Jankowski scored Chicago's lone goal.

This was Lach's first complete game since Nov. 26 when he was injured seriously. He saw limited service in Montreal's last two games. Playing in his 14th season and already the record holder on assists for regular season play, Lach hit No. 400 of his career when he fed a goal-mouth pass to Geoffrion for Montreal's first goal.

Lach ran his total point count to 615, on 212 goals and 403 assists. He gave up the leadership on total points to Richard a month ago while out of the game. With his Saturday night performance, the Rocket's total is 630, made up of 373 goals and 257 assists.

Coach Dick Irvin of Montreal shuffled his lines, trying out various combinations, particularly on power plays. His newest acquisition, Andre Corrieau, fitted in everywhere. The elusive little 136-pound winger from Valleyfield of the Quebec Hockey League cut loose with speed and contributed two assists in his second game of a three-game try-out.

The end came in 2:04 of the fifth. Olson weighed 165 and Rindone 163 1/2.

A crowd of about 8,000 saw Olson, inactive since he won the title from Randy Turpin of England last October, lose the first round and then take control of the fight.
