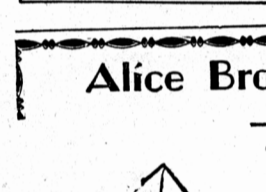

WHY GLUTAMIC ACID HELPED SOME RETARDED CHILDREN BUT NOT OTHERS
Early in 1951 I recorded the work of Dr. F. T. Zimmerman and B.B. Burgemeister, who stated in the Journal of the New York State Medical Society that they had raised the intelligence of 34 of 35 borderline, or high-grade mentally defective, children up to normal levels.

The above record was the second favorable response to glutamic acid in raising the intelligence quotient in defective children. However, toward the end of 1951, I recorded the experience of Drs. Harold G. Loeb and Read D. Tud-denham in 33 "feeble minded" children at the University of California and they found that in this particular group there was no improvement in their mentality and no rise in their intelligence quotient (I.Q.) after using glutamic acid for a lengthy period.

How can we explain how two groups of scientific research workers found such conflicting results? Scientists who report that glutamic acid is a "brain food" and those who deny its effectiveness may both be right.

Dr. Benson E. Ginsburg, associate professor and chairman of the natural science staff in the College of the University of Chicago, reported that heredity may determine whether or not brain function is improved through treatment with glutamic acid.

Other scientists, working with equal vigor, have reported that glutamic acid had no beneficial effect on intelligence. These research workers found that in two different types of mice the intelligence of feeble-minded children and of experimental animals.

WHY GLUTAMIC ACID HELPED SOME RETARDED CHILDREN BUT NOT OTHERS
Early in 1951 I recorded the work of Dr. F. T. Zimmerman and B.B. Burgemeister, who stated in the Journal of the New York State Medical Society that they had raised the intelligence of 34 of 35 borderline, or high-grade mentally defective, children up to normal levels.

The above record was the second favorable response to glutamic acid in raising the intelligence quotient in defective children. However, toward the end of 1951, I recorded the experience of Drs. Harold G. Loeb and Read D. Tud-denham in 33 "feeble minded" children at the University of California and they found that in this particular group there was no improvement in their mentality and no rise in their intelligence quotient (I.Q.) after using glutamic acid for a lengthy period.

How can we explain how two groups of scientific research workers found such conflicting results? Scientists who report that glutamic acid is a "brain food" and those who deny its effectiveness may both be right.

Dr. Benson E. Ginsburg, associate professor and chairman of the natural science staff in the College of the University of Chicago, reported that heredity may determine whether or not brain function is improved through treatment with glutamic acid.
