## S'ide Town Manager Says Plant Is Boon To Taxpayers

SUMMERSIDE — A saving of \$100 per thousand on the Summerside tax rate is the benefit enjoyed by its citizens as a result of their electric light and power utility being owned by the municipality.

This interesting statement was reported by the town manager, Joseph Brophy, in a talk to the Summerside Rotary Club on Tuesday.

The town-owned utility paid \$12,000 in taxes and returned \$76,000 in net profit last year. Mr. Brophy revealed, and said that this meant that the Summerside tax rate of \$29.00 per thousand would have had to be \$35.00, if this revenue from the

plant was not available to the town.

Illustrating the magnitude of Summerside civic administration, he said the operation of the municipality was now a \$6 million business.

The per capita debt of the town, he said, is \$211, which is about \$100 lower than Charlottetown.

Some of this debt is the result of capital expenditures for revenue earning utilities. The per capita debt which must be paid from taxes is actually only \$154, Mr. Brophy said.

He pointed out that much of the annual expenditure is outside the control of the council, but 29 per cent going to pay for debt service interest and payments on principle and education costs represent 18.5 per cent of expenditure.

Noting how the town has expanded, Mr. Brophy said that

## Truckers Threatening Complete P.E.I. Tie-Up

A spokesman for truckers in the province yesterday said a complete tie-up threatens hauling on all contract jobs this summer unless the government provides for increased rates.

The tie-up would affect all provincial highway work, wharf work and a host of other jobs.

The spokesman said the government has given no decision on rates.

The truckers went on strike last fall while working on the new federal wharf in Charlottetown. The wharf work is expected to start its spring push shortly but the truckers have vowed not to haul. They will also refuse to haul on any other contract job. They feel they are sufficiently organized across the province to stop all haulage from one end of the island to the other, although they are not united.

The truckers have asked that the rates be increased two cents per ton for the first mile at 40 cents per ton for each additional mile. This would bring the rates to 17 cents for the first mile and 10 cents every ten miles thereafter.
