

Training Courses Set For Auxiliary CD Police

Training courses leading to the establishment of an auxiliary police force for the province are expected to begin in early November, Hon. J. David Stewart, minister responsible for civil defence, said yesterday.

Mr. Stewart said that the establishment of such a police force has been under consideration by civil defence authorities for some time.

AT VITAL POINTS

Such police would be used mainly for traffic control and, in case of emergencies, would also be used to guard vital points in the province.

"I believe," said Mr. Stewart, "that every province has such a police force. To begin with,

the first auxiliary policemen will be trained in Charlottetown and Summerside. Training will be under the direction of the RCMP. It is planned to train 18 men each year until a force of 60 is reached.

Mr. Stewart said that the provincial CD organization will provide uniforms that will be similar to those used by the RCMP, "but will vary slightly." He pointed out that the auxiliary police uniforms "will be distinctive."

Qualifications standards for auxiliary police will be set by the RCMP.

Mr. Stewart suggested that "a future use of the police will be to bolster RCMP traffic forces in 1964, the Centennial Year."

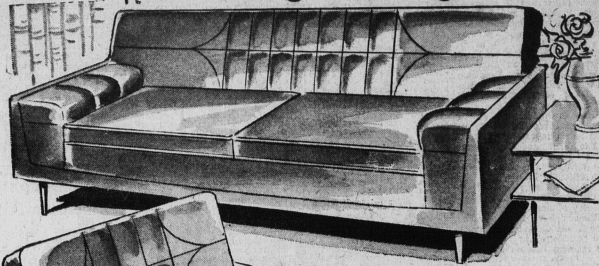

Travel Bureau Plan Scheduled

Establishment of a joint Maritime Provinces travel bureau in one of Canada's larger cities, possibly Montreal, may be discussed at a federal-provincial conference on tourism to be held in Ottawa, Nov. 26, 27 and 28.

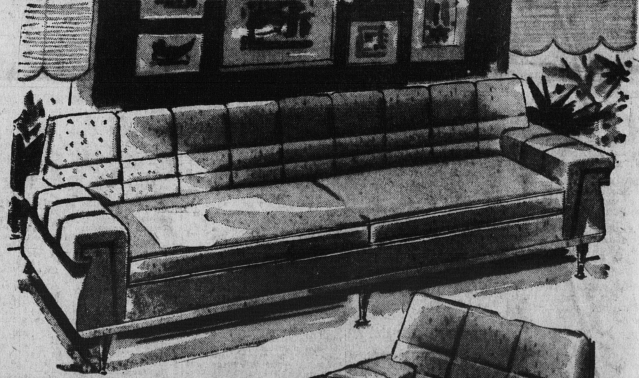
