Millionaire Is Charged

TORONTO (CP) - Millionaire mining promoter Albert Gould Friday was committed for trial on six charges of fraud involving \$827,000.

Gould was arrested following an investigation by the Ontario Securities Commission as to why stock of Cabanga Development Limited plunged from \$3.20 to 32 cents a share. He has been free on bail of \$30,000.

The Toronto promoter is faced with three charges alleging fraudulent manipulation of stock exchange transactions.

He also faces charges of defrauding Cabanga Developments Limited of \$456,000, a charge of theft of \$456,000 and one of defrauding the New York brokerage house of Joseph Farroll and Company of \$37,594.

Agree On Plan For Bridge Over Chaleur Bay

QUEBEC (CP) - Premier Duplessis Friday announced an agreement has been reached by the federal, New Brunswick and Quebec governments for the construction of a bridge across Baie des Chaleurs between Cross Point, Que., and Campbellton, N.B.

Mr. Duplessis told a press conference that the agreement, to be signed shortly, is the result of negotiations among Works Minister Green of Ottawa, Premier Fleming of New Brunswick and himself.

Construction of the bridge would begin this month or next.

Mr. Duplessis said major part of the cost is to be met by the federal government. The respective shares of New Brunswick and Quebec would not exceed \$900,000. He did not know exactly what the total cost would be.

The plan calls for a central steel structure joined from Quebec and New Brunswick by causeways. The distance between Cross Point and Campbellton - now served by ferry is about a mile.

"This bridge will be of great benefit to Quebec and New Brunswick and the agreement is a manifestation of the healthy co-operation between the three governments concerned," said Mr. Duplessis.

Electricians Get Pay Boost

SYDNEY. - (CP) - Journeymen electricians were granted an increase of 30 cents an hour in a contract signed here Friday between contractors and Local 1852 of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (I.B.E.W.).

The contract sets journeymen's rates at \$2.05 per hour. It also calls for one week vacation with pay and five paid holidays. The union originally asked for a 45-cents-an-hour increase.

Duplessis Says Farmers Pay Up

QUEBEC (CP) - Premier Duplessis said Friday Quebec farmers, loaned \$154,652,095 by the government since 1937, have shown more "honor" in repaying their debts than Quebec University students.

During a press conference Mr. Duplessis gave the latest figures on the Quebec farm loan operations. Under the Quebec Farm Loan Act farmers may borrow at 2½-per-cent interest from the Quebec Farm Credit Bureau and repay over a period of 30 years.

Mr. Duplessis said the 53,999 farmers who have been granted loans since his government set up the farm credit system have repaid \$21,696,788 on schedule and \$29,574,239 ahead of schedule.

Approve Oil Refinery Plan

FREDERICTON (CP) - A bill clearing the way for establishment of a major new industry in the greater Saint John area was approved by the New Brunswick legislature Wednesday night after being reported out of private session.

The bill will permit construction of an oil refinery costing close to \$50,000,000 by Irving Refining Ltd. in the Little River district.

The bill was reported virtually as submitted. The committee made an appropriation clause subject to approval of the lieutenant-governor-in-council and inserted a provision making the Little River watershed subject to the provincial water pollution control board.

Construction is to start immediately, with the target date sometime in 1960.

A second bill, dealing with establishment of a paper mill near the present Irving Pulp and Paper Ltd. mill in Lancaster was still under study. A final report was expected in the House this morning. Indications were the bill would be approved with some modifications.

The legislature is expected to prorogue today.
