—According to the despatches the Boers at Glencoe numbered 9000, and the British 4000.

—General Symons is dead; but his name in connection with the battle of Glencoe will live forever.

—The Dublin Fusiliers covered themselves with glory at Glencoe. They were the first to reach the Boers at close quarters.

—It is significant that the Boers have evacuated Vryburg. They evidently realize that their game at the outset has been spoiled.

—The Boer reverses at the outset, when possessed of every advantage must have a deterrent effect upon the disloyal element in Natal, Cape Colony and all over South Africa.

Oom Paul has already been made to see how foolish he was when resisting the reasonable demands of Great Britain on behalf of the Uitlanders, and in issuing his audacious ultimatum.

—While "Irish members" were talking nonsense in the British House of Commons last week, Irish soldiers were storming the heights at Glencoe, and Irishmen throughout the Empire were volunteering for service. The British Government may well, in these circumstances, take no notice of the speeches.

—The dispatch to South Africa of volunteer soldiers from the colonies and nationalities of the British Empire proves that there is really a bond of mutual sympathy between all parts of the British Empire. It is a lesson to the world that Great Britain and "Greater Britain" stand together, and will stand together, in respect to matters in which the Imperial honour and safety are involved and in respect to struggles on behalf of justice, liberty and civilization.

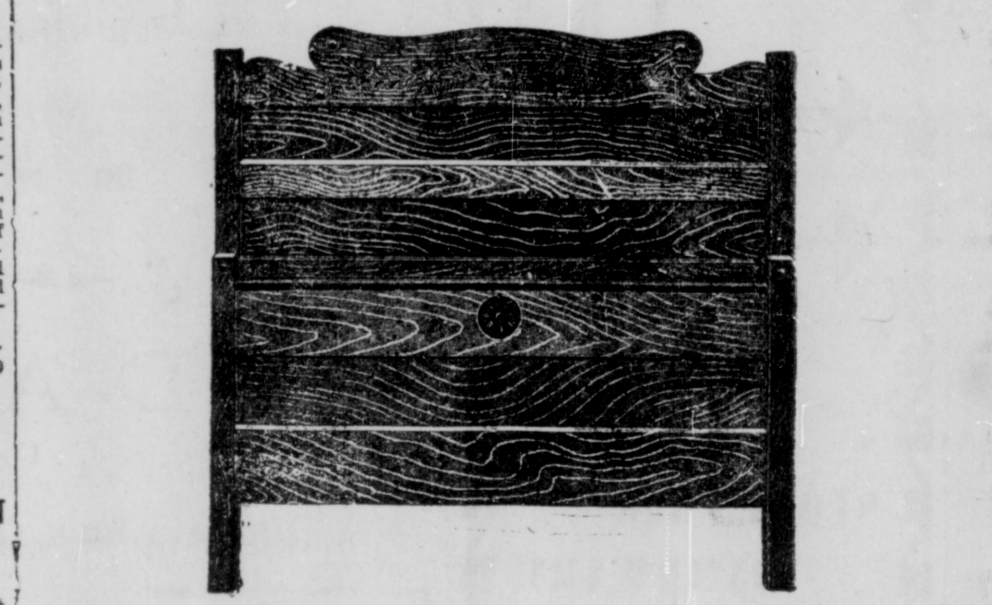
