We Surely Agree

FOR some time there have been grumblings about rain washing out home runs.

Palmer re-established himself as the odds-on favorite with a 73-69 total in the second round over the rigorous Old Troon course.

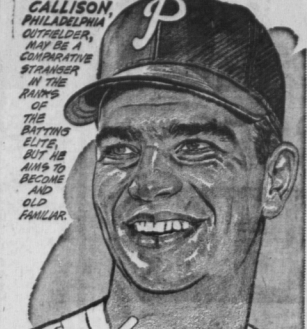
