Italy Expanding Army To Treaty Limit Of 250,000

ROME, July 24—(Reuters)—Italy is to expand her army from 170,000 to 250,000 men, the limit imposed by the peace treaty, Defence Minister Rinaldo Ossola announced.

This number would include Carabinieri (armed police) as well as troops, he said.

The announcement followed a six-hour cabinet session.

The cabinet issued a statement after its meeting approving the action taken by the United States in Korea.

Interior Minister Mario Scelba gave the cabinet detailed information about measures he plans to "guarantee peace and order in the country in the face of the (Communist) fifth column," the announcement added.

The cabinet approved his measures and decided to reinforce the 75,000 armed carabinieri at the minister's disposal.

Ministers also discussed urgent security measures regarded as necessary "in view of the international situation."

The decision is expected to enable Italy to bring her force speedily to the treaty limit of 12 divisions.

It is understood that the accent will be on equipping the divisions with modern anti-tank and anti-aircraft weapons.

It is understood that Italian defensive plans will be concentrated, in the first place, on equipping a force sufficient to hold the 50 miles, Alpine foothills on Italy's north-eastern frontier.

Most complete element of Italy's

defences is her 67,000-ton fleet, which will join the British Mediterranean Fleet and American naval units next month in manoeuvres in the Adriatic.

Gaston Ramon Discoverer of Anatoxins To Visit Canada

Word has been received that Dr. Gaston Ramon, President of the Office International des Epizooties, will be in Montreal in September to take part in the joint meeting of the Canadian Veterinary Medical Association and the Veterinary Surgeons of the Province of Quebec. This national meeting will be held in the Windsor Hotel on September 7, 8, and 9. Some 600 delegates from all parts of Canada and from other countries are expected to attend.

Dr. Ramon is famous for his remarkable studies on the phenomena of immunity. A veterinarian, he has held the post of Assistant-Director of the Pasteur Institute, Paris; he is known as the discoverer of the anatoxins. Before Dr. Ramon's discovery vaccination against bacteria was possible but not against their toxins and it is he who succeeded in developing a method enabling the use of such toxins in immunization against diphtheria and tetanus. As we know there were no cases of tetanus in the armed forces during the last war, although this terrible disease claimed a great many lives during the First World War.

Dr. Ramon also discovered a well known method of inoculation for the titration of sera and toxins. To Dr. Ramon science is also indebted for his discovery of the principle of the adjuvants in immunity. This discovery has helped to improve the methods of vaccination.

The Office International des Epizooties, of which Dr. Ramon is President, is an organized body co-ordinating all the measures pertaining to the fight against con-

tagious diseases in animals in the various countries of the world. Dr. Ramon is a member of the Academy of Science and of the Academy of Medicine, Paris, and has been given the title of Grand Officer of the Legion d'Honneur.

It will not be Dr. Ramon's first visit to Canada. He came to the University of Toronto in 1926 to help in setting up the production of anatoxins in this country. Canada was the first country after France to apply vaccination on a large scale against diphtheria according to the method developed by Dr. Ramon.

BRUSSELS, July 24—(Reuters)—An uneasy calm pervaded Belgium, kingdom without a king for six years, now divided and ruled once again by 40-year-old Leopold III.

Belgians could not be sure whether this was the lull before the storm, forecast by anti-Leopold leaders who threatened a wave of unrest if the King returned, or a sign that these inflammatory speeches had not reflected popular feeling.

King Leopold, who came home Saturday after six years' exile with an appeal to the people for "concord," spent Saturday night at the heavily-guarded Royal Palace at Laeken.

He did not move from the palace Sunday.

Chiang-Kai-Shek Shakes Party

TAIPEI, Formosa, July 24—(AP)—While his artillery on the outpost island of Quemoy fought a duel with Communist shore batteries, Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek today ordered the most sweeping changes ever made in his Nationalist party.

The reorganization is designed to put his political house in better shape for the struggle with Communism.

The immediate battle with Chinese Communists was being fought by the Quemoy artillery. The long-range duel was a possible prelude to Red invasion of Quemoy, which lies just off the mainland near the Communist port of Amoy. It is 100 miles west of Formosa.

Communist artillery opened fire Saturday. As the Nationalist emplacements on Quemoy replied, Red shelling intensified. The duel continued Saturday night and Sunday.
