Disease Threat Seen By Montreal Doctor

By RENOIT HOULE OTTAWA (CP) - Some diseases, all but wiped out through medicating curative achievements, could spring back to threatening proportions through the negligence of doctors and the general public, a Montreal doctor said here.
Another Montreal doctor warned against the use of horse serum in the treatment of tetanus (lockjaw) and urged a ban on the treatment.

The warning about the possible resurgence of all-but-eliminated diseases came from Dr. Albert Royer of Ste. Justine Hospital, and was delivered to the current conference of the Association of French-speaking Doctors of Canada.
Referring to such diseases as rickets, scurvy and nutritional anemia, he said: "These diseases have been occurring more and more frequently during the last few years."

Amish Children Weep, Hide As School Bus Roundup Starts

OELWEIN, Iowa (AP) - Weeping Amish children fled into cornfields and wooded areas here to avoid being put on buses and transported to public schools.
The children's mothers stood by crying as the youngsters ran off to hide while Buchanan county officials searched them.
One boy, Emanuel Borntager, 15, was caught by Deputy Sheriff Tony Wengert and put on a bus. The boy offered no physical resistance.
Later Wengert and County Attorney Harlan Lemon picked up a little girl. But officials released the two children and retreated from the area.

Conservation Of Tuna Urged

ROME (AP) - Fisheries experts of the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization have recommended that an international commission be set up to conserve tuna and tuna-like fish in the Atlantic Ocean.
The technical committee on fisheries of the FAO conference also recommended that FAO Director-General B. R. Sen call a conference next year to establish the proposed commission.
Tuna is one of the most important commercial fish going into international fish trade, FAO said, and is found in all seas and oceans.
It said almost all fishing nations do at least some tuna fishing, with 300,000 metric tons caught last year. There are no national quotas.

The opera house now receives a government subsidy of £175,000 (\$2.63 million) for every £1 (\$3.76) it takes in. During the year 1964-65 it received a subsidy of £769,132 (\$2,307,396) for the opera and ballet.
