Drop In U.S. Farm Income

WASHINGTON (AP) — Total farm income in the United States fell nearly \$1,000,000,000 last year, the U. S. agriculture department said today.

While this was happening, a department report said, the income of the non-farm segment of the American economy was rising above 1954 levels.

The department said the income of the U. S. farm population, from all sources last year totalled a little more than \$19,000,000,000 for an individual average of \$860.

Canadian-Designed Pulpwood Carrier Latest In Bush Aid

MONTREAL (CP)—A Canadian-designed pulpwood carrier, which may soon replace the horse and tractor in bush camps, will go into commercial production shortly.

Called the "Mark IV Logger," the carrier has passed strict tests in speedy, economical transport of cord wood from stump to road or logger over rugged bush country.

January Coal Output Higher

OTTAWA (CP)—Canadian coal production rose 14.5 per cent in January to 1,660,000 tons from last year's corresponding total of 1,450,000 tons.

At the same time landed imports increased 22.4 per cent to 721,400 tons from 589,300 in 1955, the bureau of statistics reported Monday.

The output in tons by province with last year's in brackets: Alberta 626,000 (489,400); Nova Scotia 509,000 (486,900); Manitoba 325,000 (222,900); British Columbia and Yukon 132,000 (120,600); and New Brunswick 68,000 (69,800).
