New York Stocks Bank Of Montreal Annual Statement

NEW YORK, (AP) - The stock market succeeded in breaking through a new high last week in the long recovery drive from the mid-September low of the year. The kick ahead came on the final trading day of the week after a Thanksgiving Day recess. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced \$120 on the week and stands at \$108.70. There was a disposition in some Wall Street quarters to attach more than normal significance to Friday's rapid climb. Because of the sustained upward swing of the market for the last 2 1/2 months, a technical correction retracing one-third to two-thirds of the previous gain could normally be expected.

Saturday, however, the federal reserve pointed out that the year 1953 will break all previous records for economic activity in spite of the falling off in business since the middle of the year. The five most active issues last week on the New York stock exchange were:

Chrysler up 1-4 at 63 1/2 with 73,300 shares traded. Lockheed up 5-8 at 29 1/4, RKO Theatres up 1-4 at 4 3/4, 20th Century-Fox up 1-2 at 19 3/4, and Radio Corp. up 3-8 at 21 7/8.

Biggest gainer on the most active list was General Electric up 6 3/4 at 89 3/4, the 12th most active issue. Canadian stocks closed the week lower. Canadian Pacific gained 5-8, Dome Mines advanced 1-2. Distillers Seagram was up 1-4 and International Nickel added 1-8.

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, (AP) - Steel production dropped another three points last week to 87.5 per cent of rated capacity or 1,972,000 net tons, the lowest output since August, 1952, when the industry was recovering from a strike. Steel Magazine, reporting this today, said the continued decline was due to lowered demand, the Thanksgiving holiday and a strike in the Pittsburgh area.

Despite the drop, the metalworking weekly said the outlook for the first part of next year is for a strengthening of demand. It cited a report that General Motors Corporation, one of the biggest consumers, is planning to boost its steel orders for car production 17 per cent over last year's first-quarter orders. Orders for steel to make trucks, however, are expected to be down seven per cent.

Supply of various forms of finished steel continues to increase, with more and more products reaching the easy-to-get stage every day, Steel said. Consumers now are displaying more interest in knowing exactly the cost of steel delivered at their plants, and the steel manufacturers are beginning to include transportation cost in their quoted prices.

Fire Causes Heavy Damage At Pusan

PUSAN, Korea, Saturday, (AP) - Flames 50 feet high burned out of control in this jammed seaport today, driving thousands of refugees through the crowded streets as it razed hundreds of clustered homes and shops. One officer estimated in the early hours of the fire that as many as 1,000 to 2,000 houses and shops had burned.

There was no immediate reports of deaths although it was almost certain some residents must have died in the flames.

Bank Of Montreal Annual Statement

MONTREAL, (CP) - The Bank of Montreal in its annual statement Monday reported profits for the year of \$13,892,876 after allowing for depreciation of premises and equipment and providing for contingencies. The figure compares with profits of \$11,586,778 in 1952. After taxes of \$6,650,000, net earnings were \$7,042,676, compared with \$5,868,778 a year ago.

Dividends totalled \$5,040,000 on the basis of quarterly dividends of 30 cents a share and an extra distribution of 20 cents. The total of \$140 was an increase of 15 cents over the 1952 figure. After payment of dividends, \$2,002,676.65 remaining was added to the 1952 profit and loss balance of \$702,880.34, bringing the total in this account to \$2,705,556.97. Transferred to the rest account left the balance in profit and loss at \$705,536.97.

Deposits were at a new high of \$2,226,960,000, an increase of \$79,059,000 during the year. Assets are \$2,364,374,000, up \$77,000,000 and exceeding public liabilities by \$96,705,000.

Food Shortage In Tibet Reported

NEW DELHI, (Reuters) - Communist China has withdrawn a large number of troops from Tibet because of an acute food shortage. Tibetan travellers arriving here said Friday.

The food shortage, coupled with high prices and dissatisfaction with the present regime in the country, has caused a large increase in the number of Tibetans applying at Kalimpong for permission to migrate to India.

One of the Tibetans who crossed into India said there was a considerable degree of dissatisfaction in Tibet at a Communist decision to ban all political parties there with the exception of their own.

Heavy Volume Of Christmas Express Is Anticipated

MONTREAL, Nov. 25. - With a heavy volume of Christmas express traffic anticipated this year, George H. Griffin, manager of the Express Traffic Association of Canada, today urged that express parcels be sent as early as possible to insure that they reach their destinations before the yuletide holiday.

To avoid disappointment express parcels should be sent from centres in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island to British Columbia not later than December 10; to Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, December 12; to Newfoundland and Ontario, December 14; and to Quebec and within the three Maritime Provinces December 15.

NEW DISASTER STRIKES

ATHENS, (AP) - New disaster hit the victims of the recent Greek earthquakes Thursday when a blizzard swept away the tents in which they had sought temporary shelter. All communications in the Ionian Sea were reported suspended. The 845-ton Swedish freighter Argo was reported to have run aground at Rhodes.

Plastic Sap Buckets Now

TORONTO, (CP) - Now it's plastic sap buckets. Actually, they're bags, light enough that a man can carry a score or more of empty ones. They are intended to replace the familiar metal buckets.

At the top is a reinforced eyelet to slip over a hook on the spile. A flap covers the top to keep out dust and twigs. The bottom has a tap to enable the bags to be drained without taking them off the tree.

When the season is over, the sap bags are gathered up, turned inside out and either sponged off or washed in a washing machine. For storing, they have finger grips at each bottom corner by which they can be hung on pegs during the summer. Their United States manufacturer, who is thinking of extending operations to Canada, says they will last 20 years.

Details of the sap bags were announced by the federal department of agriculture, which said it plans to test them next spring.

700 Steelmakers Return To Jobs

WINNIPEG, (CP) - More than 700 Winnipeg steelworkers have returned to work or will be at their jobs Monday following settlement of their eight-week wage strike.

A new contract with the two companies concerned gives them a nine-cent-an-hour wage increase by Feb. 1, 1954.

Employees at Dominion Bridge Co. Ltd. and its subsidiary, Manitoba Bridge and Engineering Works Ltd. voted Wednesday night to return to work.

The employees belong to locals 4095 and 4087 of the United Steelworkers of America CIO-CCL. Details of the agreement were released Thursday by Labor Minister G. E. Greenlay. He said the settlement was a compromise between the conciliation board's recommendations, agreed to by the company before the strike, and union's original demands.

FLOWN TO HOSPITAL

PANMUNJOM, (AP) - A wounded Communist Czech officer was flown here Saturday from the American hospital ship Consolation in Inchon harbor to a North Korean hospital. The Czech officer was a member of a neutral nations truce inspection team at Inchon. Other Czech officers said he had shot himself accidentally Thursday.
