# Island Cattlemen Make Best Showing Of Week

HALIFAX — Prince Edward Island cattlemen made their strongest showing of the week at the Atlantic Winter Fair in the dual purpose Shorthorn class. They took the grand female championship and the premier exhibitors award and the reserve, and they also took the grand reserve male title.

Waldron MacPhee and Son (Byron), Elmwood, took the grand female championship with their mature cow, Dynoro Louise, and this makes the sixth straight time she has been grand champion at shows where she competed. She's never been beaten thus far. But this is the first major regional show where she was tested, though she did take the grand at Charlottetown in August.

Herbert took the premier exhibitors banner — for the most points scored in the classes that are eligible and Keith Barrett was just two points back.

# Military Man-In-Space Program Opened By U.S. With Big Rocket

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP) — A hefty Titan III rocket flawlessly flew a space aerobic act Thursday, hurling an unmanned Gemini spaceship 5,000 miles to open the U.S. military man-in-space program — then orbited four satellites, including one packing decoys.

The recovery ship *Lasalle* plucked the capsule from the water at 12:21 p.m. and began a two-week voyage to Cape Kennedy. Here, engineers will examine it briefly then send it to McDonnell Aircraft Corp. at St. Louis, Mo., for several weeks of checks to determine whether the shield would protect astronauts.

# Bonaventure Innards Described As 'Junk'

# Re-captured Bank Robber Gets Bed In Place Of Cell

MONTREAL (CP) — Andre Daoust, an escaped bank robber who had shot and slugged his way out of previous attempts to recapture him, was in critical condition in hospital Thursday after his midnight arrest by a gang of policemen with orders to capture or kill.

Police had expressed the theory Daoust, Quebec's most-wanted criminal, might have taken a poison in the few minutes between the time he agreed to surrender and the time he walked out of a west-end motel room, hands clasped over his head.

# RCMP Raid Is Reported On Ottawa Map-Making Plant

TORONTO (CP) — The Star says an RCMP raid on a federal map-making plant at Ottawa has resulted in "growing concern that secret hydrographic charts of military value have fallen into the hands of Russian agents."

The newspaper adds it was learned that the counter-espionage officers found "evidence that secret maps bearing military details of Canada's eastern sea frontier may have been transmitted to Soviet or other Iron Curtain agents."

But the doctors said that the abdominal difficulty had caused Johnson pain during his 17-day journey to the Far East, and that his exertions apparently had caused the defect to enlarge to a protrusion about the size of a silver dollar.
