THE LISTENER.

The Duke of Argyll has been in possession of the family titles and estates for 50 years. Prince de Sagan, the Ward McAllister of Paris, has had a stroke of paralysis. He is 61 years of age. John D. Rockefeller has presented to Vassar college a library of 2,700 books purchased in Germany. Frederick Miller, a telegraph "messenger boy," of Branford, Conn., is 87 years old and can walk long distances. Viscount Royston, who has become Earl of Harwicke by the death of his father, is a broker on the London Stock Exchange. Eugene Georges, the coachman who exhibited such bravery during the Paris fire, has been rewarded with the honor of knighthood in the Legion of Honor. Galen Clark, who has been guardian of the Yosemite valley for 24 years, has resigned on account of age and infirmities. He will occupy a house in the valley. Eugene Merrick of Chicago, now 44 years old, entered the army as a drummer boy when he was 13 years of age, and says he was the youngest soldier in the war. M. Chauvin, a doctor of laws and lecturer in the law faculty of the University of Paris, has been forbidden to give his law lectures on account of his expressing publicly socialist opinions in politics. Speaker Gully of the British house of commons has just cast his deciding vote for the first time since assuming office, there being a tie vote for the second reading of an unimportant bill. It is 30 years since a speaker has voted. Senator Wellington of Maryland interests himself while the senate is in session in looking over newspaper clippings about himself. He subscribes to a news clipping bureau and reads everything that is said about him with a great deal of interest. Congressmen Lanham of Texas and Pierce of Tennessee, who occupy adjoining seats in the center of the Democratic side of the hall of representatives, are seldom, if ever, absent from a session of the house, whether that session be for five minutes or five hours. John W. Gulteau brother of President Garfield's slayer, is connected with one of the largest insurance companies in the country and lives in New York. Mr. Gulteau is one of the high priced employees and gets a salary of \$8,000 or \$10,000 per year. He is a most estimable man. Bishop Talbot of Rochester, England, started the borough of Southwark by walking through its streets early one weekday morning in full vestments, with mitre and cope. He had to open a church, and he preferred to walk to it from the house where he had dressed rather than take a cab. Edward Downes, who has been United States consul general at Amsterdam for the last four years, has decided to study for the Roman Catholic priesthood at the American college in Rome. He is a native of New Haven, of which city he was city clerk during the mayoralty of Joseph B. Sargent.

The "Penny Dreadful" in Germany. The "penny dreadful" is known in Germany as the "Schauerroman," and it appears there to produce the same effect of inspiration on the boyish mind as it does here. At Schwelm a few days ago ten lads, aged from 11 to 19, were charged with a series of burglaries and highroad robberies for miles around. It appears that they had been excited by their common study of the "shudder" romance "Schinderhannes" to constitute themselves into a band of robbers. Each youth had adopted a robber's name, as the Black Wolf, Antony Bear's Heart, Iron Fist, Sly Fox, Falcon's Eye, and the like. Every member of the band was sworn to loyalty upon the dagger and the revolver of "the chief." The band, happily, had only four revolvers among the ten, and these were discharged at the police who tracked them to their "cave," though without hurt to the officers of the law. No fewer than 70 keys were found in their possession.

Sprinkle a little stone lime in the stock tank and not a particle of green scum will form in the water. When the lime loses its strength and scum begins to form, wash out the tank and repeat the dose. It is cheap, not only harmless, but wholesome, keeps the water sweet and saves work. But do not put in enough lime to form limewater. That is not good for your cows to drink. When you buy a new churn, get one with its hoops and other metallic parts of galvanized iron. This prevents rust.
