MAGIC makes baking fine-textured, delicious! CINNAMON SANDWICH BISCUITS Mix and sift once, then sift into a bowl, 2 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 1 1/4 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 3 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/4 tsp. salt and 1/4 c. fine granulated sugar. Cut in finely 4 lbs. chilled shortening. Combine 1 well-beaten egg, 1/2 c. milk and 1/4 tsp. vanilla. Make a well in dry ingredients and add liquid; mix lightly with a fork, adding milk if necessary, to make a soft dough. Knead for 10 seconds on lightly-floured board and roll out to 1/8" thickness; shape with fluted 1 1/2" cutter. Cream together 1 1/2 lbs. soft butter or margarine, 1/4 c. lightly-packed brown sugar, 1/2 tsp. grated orange rind and 1/2 tsp. ground cinnamon. Using only about half of the creamed mixture, place a small spoonful of the mixture on half of the cut-out rounds of dough; top with remaining rounds of dough and press around edges to seal. Spread biscuits with remaining creamed mixture and arrange, slightly apart, on greased cookie sheet. Bake in hot oven, 450°, about 12 minutes. Serve warm. Yield—16 biscuits.
