Acting within 24 hours of the announcement of Mayor Henry W. Wedge's plan for a community rink fund, the Kinsmen voted last evening to contribute \$1,000 to the fund. The sum of \$1,000 of the proceeds they hope to realize from their annual spring carnival being held in Summerside from May 28th to 31st inclusive. While all organizations are believed to be in full support of the Mayor's plan for creating a rink with which a new rink will be built it appears that the Summerside Kinsmen have started the fund rolling fast with the first donation of \$1,000. Continued from page 5. We must do it," said President Roland MacDonald, who occupied the chair. Another speaker pointed out that \$600,000 was spent to advertise margarine the first year it came on the market, and not one penny had been spent to keep butter before the public. "The eye and taste appeal is used for ice cream, cheese, milk and other products to some extent, but not daily and 288 weekly papers are available to expand the market, especially for fluid milk," President McDonald emphasized.

Hon. Mr. Cullen

Hon. Eugene Cullen, Minister of Industry and Resources, gave an outline of what may be anticipated in the way of improved methods, which are not perfected yet, in the processing of milk. "I hope," said Mr. Cullen, "that we will not become over-enthusiastic about dry milk, which is being successfully returned to liquid by the addition of sweet butter, and water, and afterwards homogenized". Difficulties have arisen because of the quality of water added, and even with our own island water, there is a definite milk-and-water taste. "The greatest up-lift the whole dairy business can receive," said the Minister, "will probably be through the opening of the market north of the Seven Islands when the two Railways under construction there have made it possible for settlers to go in. At present only construction gangs are a source of revenue for food-stuffs, and although the prices demanded are not a hindrance, the shipments are purchased and taken to the Labrador by the Steamship Company, and so far we have not been able to do much towards securing any of the business for direct selling. The shortness of the season renders the situation difficult. "I believe," said Mr. Cullen, "the desire to improve the local airport facilities, may be influenced by the need of flying fresh products to Seven Islands and Newfoundland." Messrs Roy Gidd, Harry Wood, Smith MacFarlane, Major MacRae and the secretary, Percy Gay also took part in the discussions.

Address To Graduates

Dr. J. B. Downing in his address to the class offered his sincere congratulations to them and referred to the conditions under which they labored, especially during the past winter when their nurses homes were so far removed from the hospital. You have received the highest intellectual and moral training, the greatest and noblest of ideals, and with them go the duty to spread these by word and deed. Leadership in any field of endeavor is often sadly lacking, and yours is a great and golden opportunity. Among the ideals you have gained and which you must cultivate throughout your professional life, the greatest of all is kindness. Tonight, you are on the threshold of a new life. You are a credit to your parents and to your teachers both within and without the hospital. Pride of achievement must be yours and most certainly is theirs. I wish you all the success possible in your chosen profession, and I know that you will carry aloft the torch of service which has been handed you, and by inspiration and example, light the way of those to follow you."
