Canada's Chess Team Defeated

AMSTERDAM (CP)—Canada's chess team suffered its first defeat in consolation play of the world championships Thursday as Switzerland defeated the Canadians 3-1 to knock them out of first place.

The Swiss victory gave them a 27-13 record after 10 rounds of consolation play to Canada's 26 1/2-13 1/2.

Frank Anderson of Toronto, unbeaten in the consolation draw and defeated only once since the championships began Aug. 28, was the lone Canadian victor Thursday, defeating Switzerland's M. Blau.

Suffering his only defeat at the hands of Julio Bilbao-hon of Argentina in the eliminations that consigned Canada to the consolation bracket, Anderson has won nine and drawn one of his consolation matches for an over-all record of 11-1-2.

Paul Valtanos of Hamilton suffered his first consolation defeat Thursday, losing to E. Vieweg of Switzerland. Abe Yanofsky of Winnipeg lost to J. Kupper and Dr. Theodore Bohatirchuk was beaten by E. Bhand.

In the championship draw Russia's defending champion came close to clinching the title by scoring two wins and drawing against West Germany in the fourth round with one game adjourned. Their 27 1/2-7 1/2 record gives them a six-point edge over second place Yugoslavia with both countries having nine matches left to play.

Phillies Defeat Pirates Twice

PHILADELPHIA (AP)—Philadelphia Phillies defeated Pittsburgh Pirates Thursday, scoring their third and fourth victories in 22 hours. They took a 7-6 victory in the ninth inning of a game suspended Aug. 15 and won 4-2 in a regulation game. Stan Lopata's three-run first-inning homer sewed up the second game.

Robin Roberts pitched the one-inning necessary to win the suspended game, gaining credit for his 23rd win of the season and his second in two days. The pair of victories moved the Phillies into a virtual tie with Cincinnati Redlegs for fourth place in the National League.

Herman Wehmiller earned his 10th win against 11 setbacks in the nightcap. Ashburn had walked and Mel Clark singled before Lopata rapped a pitch out of the park.
