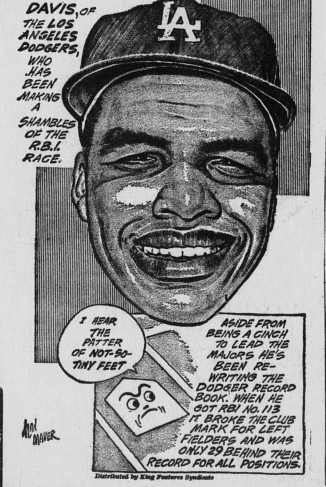
Junior Abbies Hold Practice
