

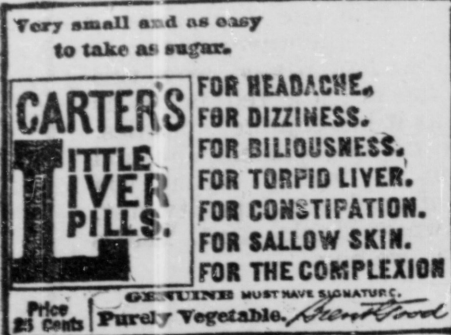

THE MARITIME STOCK BREEDERS' ASSOCIATION.

Announcement is made in this issue of the annual meeting of our Maritime stockmen at Charlottetown, on the 23th and 29th of this month. It is pleasing to note that our stockmen generally are rallying round their association and that the Government of the day are lending their co-operation to the work which this Association is undertaking, viz., to help Maritime farmers to make more money from their labors through the medium of more and better live stock.

The work covers an immense scope of thought and effort, and but a few feeble steps have already been taken, but the officers and members of the Association are full of hope, and with hearty co-operation and well-directed efforts we hope ere long to see the live stock business in the premier position among the occupations of these provinces.

It is becoming more and more a settled fact that it is through useful horses, cattle, sheep, swine and poultry that the products of our soil can best be marketed.

Cheese, butter, beef, mutton, lamb's wool, bacon and other pork products, eggs and poultry meat are among the articles which can be most easily shipped and which are most in demand in the markets of the world.

As to whether these products suit the markets, as to whether they are produced at a profit or a loss, depends so much upon the fitness of the animals we keep for the purpose to which we put them and the food and care that we give them, and too much education and discussion on the lines of breeding and feeding cannot be given. With a view to helping its members to better knowledge of their business, with a view to helping them by co-operating to get concessions from Governments and corporations, which they could not secure as individuals, the Maritime Stock Breeders' Association was organized in 1896.

Four annual meetings have already been held, as above stated, and a fifth will be held at Charlottetown, P. E. I., on Wednesday and Thursday, November 28th and 29th inst. The programme elsewhere outlined will be a full one and a very large attendance is expected. The first day will be taken up with general business and educational work and a large public gathering in the evening to listen to addresses from Hon. John Dryden and other prominent speakers.

On the second day, the morning will be devoted to the election of officers and new business, and the afternoon probably to addresses from representatives of the different Maritime Governments, with a banquet in the evening as a wind up to the more serious business of the meeting.

The questions in regard to the extension of the work of the Association, the registration of stock, the management of exhibitions and transportation of stock, both to exhibitions and for breeding and market purposes, are all questions of the utmost importance and we hope to see all the members taking a hand in the discussions.

Special railway rates will be arranged for this meeting and we hope to see a large attendance from all parts of the Maritime Provinces. Crossings can be made from Pictou or Point du Chene. Co-operative Farmer.

NOTES AND COMMENTS.

Recent spectroscopic research indicates that the rarer metals are very widely distributed. Messrs. W. H. Hartley and Hugh Ramage having found the extremely rare metal gallium in 31 out of 91 iron ores obtained from the Royal Dublin College of Science, while these ores nearly all had unexpected constituents Rutherfordium was present in most of them with indium in the siderites, or iron carbonates. The same chemists have now studied meteorites, finding gallium in various proportions, in meteoric irons, but not in all meteorites. A little rubidium also exists in the iron. The chief points of difference between the meteoric and terrestrial irons are found to be that the former contain much nickel and cobalt with only minute traces of manganese, while the ordinary iron ores contain manganese with only traces of nickel and cobalt. Sodium and potassium occur in meteoric irons in small proportions. Meteoric irons, like iron ores and manufactured irons, contain copper, lead and silver; meteoric stones; unlike meteoric irons, contain chromium and manganese.

While powders are made more or less smokeless, it seems incredible that guns may be made noiseless as well as flashless, but this is what Col. Humbert seeks to accomplish. He expects further a very material reduction in recoil. His plan consists in screwing to the muzzle a

block containing a shutter that ordinarily falls inward to a horizontal position, but which, as the projectile is about to make its exit at full velocity, is forced upward against the opening by the passage of some of the gases under it. This prompt closing of the gun behind the projectile confines the gases—still at high pressure—and prevents the sudden entrance of air that is one of the chief causes of detonation. Small holes in the rear of the block permit the gases to leak out slowly. Experiments through the aid of a French factory have shown the anticipated great reduction of flash and noise, without much effect on recoil.

Several successful cases of amputation by the natural method of allowing the injured or dead part to slough away from the living, sawing through bone being the only cutting done, have been reported by M. Reclus. The wound is first injected with water at 140° F., which arrests bleeding and warms the collapsed patient, then disinfected with a permanganate of potash solution, and finally embalmed in a dressing of several antiseptics. The dead part is stated to become entirely separated from the living in three weeks.
